The Friar's Nook

Saint Luke tells us that the disciples were full of joy after the Lord had definitively left them and ascended to heaven. Surely, we would expect them to have been surprised and sad. In reality, the world had not changed at all, and Jesus had already gone to heaven. Furthermore, the task that he had entrusted to them of carrying the gospel to the end of the world, preaching it to all nations, seemed unrealizable, a job that from every perspective exceeded their strength. We asked ourselves then, how could they be so happy? Every separation is sad and even painful, how is it possible that their final farewell did not fill them with sadness? How can we understand it?

Evidently, they did not feel abandoned, nor did they believe that Jesus had distanced himself from them to an inaccessible and distant heaven. They were sure of Jesus' presence with them. As he himself had assured them: "I am with you always, to the end of the world" (Mt 28:20). In a different way than his relationship with the Lord had been until that moment, but equally real, he continued to be with them. And what is even more important, they would never lose this new and powerful relationship. But in what sense is the Lord near us now?

Although the Lord is no longer physically with his people, his presence among his people is still real. He had promised this after sending them to preach throughout the world. And on another previous occasion he had told them: "where two or three are gathered in my name, there I am in their midst" (Mt 18:20).

When we think about it, we realize that it is wonderful, and in some sense totally incomprehensible, that the Lord entrusted the greatest undertaking of all time to a handful of men without material resources, social influence, or academic training. The only possible explanation we can find for how they could really take the gospel to the ends of the world, crossing all kinds of cultural and geographical barriers, is that the risen and ascended Lord acted in and through them. Only in this way can we understand the missionary advance of the church in the first century, overcoming all kinds of obstacles in an incredible way. God used simple people, but wholeheartedly devoted to Christ, willing even to lose their own lives, sensitive to the leading of the Holy Spirit, and ready to use all available opportunities for the advancement of the gospel.

Let us always ask the Lord to work in us too to continue that Work with the same fidelity that they had and always with joy because we know that the Lord is with us always.

Laudato Si' Week May 11-12

From Pope Francis' letter Laudato Si' #160: "We need to see that what is at stake is our own dignity. Leaving an inhabitable planet to future generations is, first and foremost, up to us. The issue is one which dramatically affects us, for it has to do with the ultimate meaning of our earthly sojourn".
