Friars Nook

This week at our Pastoral Council meeting, one of the items on the agenda was continuing education in the parish. There was an idea to talk about the gifts of the Holy Spirit since most of us only heard of them when we were being Confirmed and haven't thought much about them since. Given that, for the next several of my Friar's Nooks. I'd like to discuss those gifts and how they can relate to our lives daily.

The first gift that's listed is the gift of Wisdom, that is the ability to understand what is true or right, especially in decision making. We are presented with decisions each and every day. The question is for us "do use their gift of wisdom to choose and to do the right thing?" After this past week's election back home in the United States, it appears that that gift was not evident amongst the majority of people. If you recall when Solomon became king, he asked the Lord for just one thing - great wisdom. But even Solomon reveals that with great wisdom doesn't always come the ability to use that wisdom. King Solomon did do a lot of things that were quite wise, but he also did other things that were quite foolish and even sinful.

It reveals to us our human nature. If we simply follow the wisdom of human nature, we will only do things that we perceive are good for us, not necessarily good for others or the world. The gift the Holy Spirit gives us in wisdom is a divine gift and transcends our human nature. As Pope Francis says: *"It is not simply human wisdom, the fruit of knowledge and experience? The wisdom the Holy Spirit grants is the* grace of being able to see things through God's eyes."

This means being wise affects all of us and the world we live in. It is not always an easy choice hence the need for the divine assistance. But when we do choose to use the wisdom of God, it is a good thing for us and for everyone else. Seeing the world through God's eyes reveals a world in its perfection and opens our eyes to seeing what we can do to return it to that perfection, by caring for others and caring for the world itself. If we only think only of ourselves and our wants and desires, we reject that gift of the Spirit and become of no use to others and even of no use to ourselves.

The gift of wisdom fills us with those "Aha" moments as we realize what the call of God is and how to make it real in our lives in our world. Remember these gifts are given not simply for us to work on the Kingdom of God but rather to experience that joy in our daily lives.
