

It seems that fall has arrived in Toronto. The brisk mornings and the leaves beginning to change. Pretty soon I'll have to put Bodhi's sweater on to take him for walks. And while things are cooling off outside, things are heating up at Saint Joan of Arc. Last weekend we had the Blessing of Animals which many people attended, lots of dogs, some cats (who didn't want to be there), and even a bird. We also had a Pastoral Council retreat which went well and helped set our sights on the coming year.

One of the things that the Pastoral Council noticed was that we have a lot more young families in attendance. In fact, last week we had split up the Children's Liturgy of the Word into two classes because there were so many children. We're looking for ways to serve these young families better and to encourage our young people to be more active in the parish community. We are open to any ideas you might have, especially if you fit into that demographic.

A lot of times people think of the youth as the "future of the church". But they really are the "present of the church." They are present in both senses of the word. They're here now, and they are also gift to the church as a whole. We can't put them off until tomorrow because they may not come back tomorrow.

Pope Francis has said that we are "a Church that wants to move forward together by listening, dialogue, and the constant discernment of the Lord's will." This requires us to listen not simply to adults but to all who will speak from the youngest on up. He goes on to say about young people: "Never to leave us without your good way of 'making a mess'; your drive, like that of a clean and well-tuned engine; and your own particular way of living and proclaiming the joy of the risen Jesus!"

Whenever we deal with people it gets messy, change is messy. (But I bet that Pope Francis doesn't have to do his own cleaning!) But we need to have the mess so that we can change for the better. We need the drive and energy of our young people in the parish, and also we need to be open to new ways of living and proclaiming Christ in our lives and in our world with joy.

In terms of joy, we'll be celebrating Oktoberfest on Saturday the 25th of this month and all are welcome, feel free to bring your non-Catholic friends to show them that we are not stodgy and too solemn. We will also be celebrating again a mass for All Souls on Friday evening at 7 PM on November 1st. Please check the bulletin if you wish to be involved in this.
