The image of Jesus as "resurrection and life" is found in the account of the resurrection of Lazarus (Jn 11:17-32). The sign of the resurrection of his friend Lazarus constitutes a high point of Jesus' messianic activity and of his revelation to the people.

The conversation with Martha contrasts the Jewish hope in the future resurrection of the dead and the present resurrection of Jesus from the dead. In New Testament times, the Jewish communities (except the Sadducees) expected the resurrection of the dead as a future and collective event. In this horizon, Jesus presents himself as the resurrector of the dead now. In him the final events of history are anticipated. The resurrection is already happening. Life is already happening: "He who believes in me, though he dies, shall live; and everyone who lives and believes in me shall never die". Our security in the eternal life that awaits us with total certainty is based on these words, for each one of us who has accepted and believed in God and his infinite Grace. Thus, we know that Death will only be the necessary step to go from this life to eternal existence. For this reason, we should not fear earthly Death, for it is no longer the end of existence but rather the beginning of eternal life.

What "I am the resurrection and the life" means, Jesus has anticipated in his historical existence. He becomes "life", the one who has been giving life, the one who has been making the written text true: He who wants to save his life will lose it, he who loses his life will gain it. This Jesus becomes "resurrection", who has spent his life making himself vulnerable to death and resurrecting those condemned to many forms of death: physical, existential, relational, religious... The story of Jesus can be told as a story of love, faith and hope.
