# JUBILEE YEAR CORNER: Special Note

Over the last two weeks, how to make a Jubilee pilgrimage has been discussed. We discussed visiting Christ in those in need, but also in special churches designated by the Pope and Cardinal Leo. But one very important church was left out!

Near St Vincent de Paul, at 110 Franklin Avenue, one finds the Ukrainian Catholic Cathedral of St Josaphat. Besides the 11 Latin rite Churches in Toronto, St Josaphat's has also been designated as a holy site for making a Jubilee pilgrimage. The Divine Liturgy is celebrated each morning at 8am. On Sundays, the Divine Liturgy is at 9 and 11am. The 1914 Church burned down and was rebuilt in 1965. Its images and relics are stunning and well worth a visit. The Church is dedicated to St Josaphat, bishop and martyr. St Joseph died on November 12, 1623. He was around 45 years old. He was the first Eastern Catholic canonized by the Pope.

When St Josephat was a teenager, the Union of Brest took place, reuniting many Orthodox Christians with the Holy See after hundreds of years of separation. Burning with zeal, Josaphat became a monk in a Ruthenian Catholic monastery. He lived at a time of great unrest. Many Orthodox resented these new Catholics. Many Catholics also distrusted them. Josaphat gave his life for the union of the Church, eventually being made a bishop. He once preached: "You people of Vitebsk want to put me to death. You make ambushes for me everywhere, in the streets, on the bridges, on the highways, and in the marketplace. I am here among you as a shepherd, and you ought to know that I would be happy to give my life for you."

In this Jubilee Year, we can gain indulgences by visiting churches, but we can also gain indulgences by the spiritual works of mercy. St Josaphat is a model in this regard. How often in those days of division and reunion was he called upon to: 1. counsel the doubtful, 2. instruct the ignorant, 3. admonish sinners, 4. comfort the afflicted, 5. forgive offences 6. bear patiently those who do us ill, and 7. pray for the living and the dead! May the Lord help us to follow his example! By imitating St Josaphat in these works of mercy, by visiting Christ in our neighbors, we too can gain indulgences. We can thus live to the full this Holy Year of Hope.
