ORATORY SUMMER SCHOOL

Registration for the annual Oratory Summer School has opened. There are two sessions available. The first session offers a systematic introduction to The Catechism of The Catholic Church. This five-day course has three lectures per day and provides a solid foundation for navigating the Catechism on one's own, either for personal reading or for use in home schooling, RCIA courses or Catholic schools. Although the course has been of great use to teachers and catechists, everyday Catholics find it accessible and intellectually nourishing. The second session takes Jubilee Years as its theme, converging appropriately with 2025 being celebrated as a Jubilee Year in the universal Church and with the Toronto Oratory's own 50th anniversary, for St. Philip himself directed a confraternity dedicated to the care of Jubilee pilgrims in Rome. We shall study, among other topics, the theology and history of jubilees, Saint Philip's special association with Jubilees and the theme of the Church's Jubilee this year: Pilgrims of Hope. The first session will be July 7 to 11 and the second session July 14 to 18. The cost for each session, which includes lunch each day for those attending in person, is \$200 per person. For those attending online, the cost is \$175 per person. Accommodation is available in the seminary for \$100 per person, which covers the entire week. JUBILEE YEAR CORNER

There are many special ways to gain the Jubilee Plenary Indulgence: pilgrimages, helping Christ in the suffering, and taking part in formation opportunities. Over the past month, we have examined various ways the Church is offering this year.

But we cannot forget that every day in any year there are several practices that we can do to gain a plenary indulgence. What kinds of things have daily plenary indulgences attached?

1. Praying the Rosary in front of the blessed Sacrament or in public

2. Reading the Scriptures for 30 minutes

3. Making the Stations of the Cross in a place where the Stations are officially erected

Everyday in our parish, we have a daily rosary (M-Th at 8:40, Friday at noon, Saturday at 10:40, and Sunday at 10:25). We have the Stations of the Cross every Friday in Lent at 8pm. But one can gain the indulgence by visiting the Stations on one's own. The reading of Scriptures is open to all. "Ignorance of the Scriptures," St Jerome used to say, "is ignorance of Christ."

Whenever the Church offers a plenary indulgence, a complete remission of the temporal punishment of sins already forgiven, she is highlighting a very valuable spiritual practice! Indulgences are added to practices that the Church thinks are incredibly healing and sanctifying. What a beautiful Lenten practice of prayer: daily Mass, followed by the rosary and/or reading the Scriptures for 30 minutes in the evening, plus making time for Stations on Fridays!
