JUBILEE YEAR CORNER

The forty days of Lent have begun. But Lent 2025 is even more filled with graces of renewal than most Lents. We are in the Holy Year of 2025. What is the moving principle, the soul, the crucial animating force of the Holy Year, the Jubilee Year? The desire, the spirit, of Penance. According to the Holy See, "The Jubilee Plenary Indulgence can also be obtained through initiatives that put into practice, in a concrete and generous way, *the spirit of penance which is, in a sense, the soul of the Jubilee.*"

St Philip Neri loved to speak of making a "virtue of necessity." Every Catholic must, of necessity, spend Lent doing penance. Every day in Lent, besides Sundays, is a "day of penance." The main forms are fasting, prayer, and almsgiving. We must do something small each day that we do not like in these areas. But in the 2025 Jubilee, the Holy Year of Hope, we can gain plenary indulgences from doing the very thing we do of necessity. We just need to have the right intention and fulfill the conditions. We need to direct these penances towards the removal of temporal punishment of sins in purgatory, either for ourselves or those who have died.

But is there any specific way to do penance in this Holy Year? The Holy See suggests the following things are especially appropriate for Fridays, the day Christ died.

Fasting

- 1. Abstaining **from futile distractions** (real but also virtual distractions, for example, the use of the media and/or social networks),
- 2. Abstaining **from superfluous consumption** (for example by fasting or practising abstinence according to the general norms of the Church and the indications of the Bishops),

Almsgiving

- 3. as well as by donating a proportionate sum of money **to the poor**;
- 4. supporting **works of a religious or social nature**, especially in support of the defence and protection of life in all its phases, but also by supporting the quality of life of abandoned children, young people in difficulty, the needy or lonely elderly people, or migrants from various countries "who leave their homelands behind in search of a better life for themselves and for their families" (*Spes non confundit*, 13);
- 5. by dedicating a reasonable **portion of one's free time to voluntary activities** that are of service to the community or to other similar forms of personal commitment.

If we do these things in "a spirit of penance," in a desire to make up for our sins, we can obtain a plenary Jubilee indulgence. *Come, Holy Spirit. Stir up in our parish the spirit of penance*. Stir up in us the desire to make up for sin. How wonderful to make a virtue of necessity! How wonderful to think that in doing these penances, we are helping souls in purgatory!
