If either party has previously gone through any form of civil or religious marriage with another person, the priest is not permitted to set a date for the wedding until the Bishop's office has been consulted.

It should be noted that Catholics, in order to marry validly, must marry before the parish priest or his delegate and two witnesses. A civil marriage or a marriage before a non-Catholic minister is not a valid marriage. Couples in such "marriages" should contact a priest to have the situation rectified.

We have a committee of parishioners who are taking responsibility for much of what needs to be done picking them up at the airport, finding an apartment, taking them to various gov't offices, helping them to find jobs, etc. But we still need more help. If you are in a position to donate some of these, please contact the parish to let the Refugee Committee know what you have, so that we don't get multiple copies of the same thing: Kitchen Table, Kitchen Table Chairs, Couch, Armchair, Coffee Table, End Table, Double Bed Frame, Double Mattress, Single Bed Frame, Single Mattress*, Night Stand, Table Lamps, Bed Linens (double bed)*, Bed Linens (single bed)*, Blankets (double bed), Blankets (single bed), Pillows, Towels, Pots and pans, Cutlery Set, Glassware Set, Tableware Set, Kitchen Utensils, Electric Kettle, Microwave, Toiletries, Cleaning Supplies, Children's Toys.. *Bed linens & matrasses must be new.

We are also in need of Grocery & Department store gift cards. Finally, if anyone knows of an apartment not far from the parish that might be willing to take the family, please let us know. There is money coming from ORAT to cover rent. Please pray for the success of this charitable undertaking.
