MARRIAGES:

Couples planning to be married must contact a priest well in advance of the wedding date. They must also receive personal preparation for entering marriage.

If either party has previously gone through any form of civil or religious marriage with another person, the priest is not permitted to set a date for the wedding until the Bishop's office has been consulted.

It should be noted that Catholics, in order to marry validly, must marry before the parish priest or his delegate and two witnesses. A civil marriage or a marriage before a non-Catholic minister is not a valid marriage. Couples in such "marriages" should contact a priest to have the situation rectified.

First Communion (Grade 2 and higher)

The usual age for first Communion is grade 2. Parents of children in grade 2 or higher who have yet to be prepared for their first confession and Communion should register them in the parish's catechism program. The immediate preparation for these sacraments is the parish, rather than the school. So even if your children attend Catholic schools, you must register them for the program in the parish. Classes take place most Sundays of the year at 11 am in the parish hall. To register please call the parish and ask for Fr Christopher Huynh.

Confirmation (Grade 7 and higher)

The usual age for confirmation is grade 7. Parents of children in grade 7 & higher who have yet to be confirmed should register them in the parish's catechism program. The immediate preparation for these sacraments is the parish, rather than the school. **Even if your children attend Catholic schools, you must register them for the program.** Classes take place most Saturdays of the year at 11 am in the parish hall. **To register, please call the parish and ask for Fr Martin Hilbert.**

ADULT CATECHISM (RCIA) CLASSES

Weekly classes in the Catholic faith for adults are on Mondays at 7:30 p.m. in the parish hall. Classes will also be live-streamed over Zoom.
