Dear Friends:

The Third Sunday of Advent is here. This is Gaudete Sunday. Gaudete means to rejoice. Our readings are filled with so much joy and hope. And God knows we need joy and hope, especially with so much happening in the world and so much struggles and hardships around us.



In the 1st Reading, the prophet Zephaniah says, Sing aloud, O daughter, Zion! Our Psalm, Shout aloud and sing for joy! St. Paul, from prison writes, Rejoice in the Lord always; again, I will say, Rejoice! And in the Gospel, the

people whom John was baptizing were filled with expectation!

The Church calls for **joyful hearts** as we prepare to celebrate Christ's birth. The Third Sunday of Advent is known as Gaudete Sunday because of the first word "Rejoice" in the entrance antiphon of Sunday's Liturgy. "Rejoice" is also repeated throughout the readings and prayers. The vestments worn by the priest can be the colour rose (sometimes referred to as pink). The third candle of the Advent wreath is also rose. Both are reminders that Christ's coming is very soon; we are nearing the end of Advent, and we can hardly contain our joy. (Miller)
