Dear Friends:

2nd Sunday - January 19, 2024

Today's Gospel presents Jesus' first miracle, *The Wedding Feast at Cana!* In this miracle we see his love, concern and generosity. As the wedding went on, the wine ran out. It must have been quite an embarrassment for the couple. Mary brought it to Jesus' attention, and after a few words with his Mother, Jesus showed his glory! He performed the miracle of turning water into wine. Not just one bottle... but 600 litres! And it was a very fine wine! He did not let the bridegroom or the guests down. He rescued them in their difficulty. This miracle not only revealed his glory but it led the disciples to believe in him. Jesus does not let any of us down either. He can do infinitely more than we can imagine.


The question is: Do we let him down? St. Paul reminds us in our 2nd Reading that God's gifts to individuals are not meant primarily for personal use, but for the service of others. He tells of the many gifts of the Holy Spirit to each person, "to each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good," not for personal profit. The Spirit is supposed to be manifested in the baptized! Do we act that way? Do others see that? Do my neighbours know that? What gifts do I have? What has God bestowed on me? ... what am I good at? Am I using my gifts for my own personal profit or do I use them for the service of others? ... my time, talent and treasure? Imagine, if we used the gifts we have for the common good – even the gifts of praying, singing, teaching, caring, sharing, encouraging, supporting, motivating, -- then these gifts will grow and soon we'll see more miracles. Service to others and concern for others is the beginning of all miracles.

3rd Sunday- January 26, 2024

In our readings today we have a public proclamation from the Law and the Prophets, from Ezra and from Jesus! Each is a dramatic scene, and we can't help but feel the excitement of the listeners. In Nehemiah, Ezra is reading from the *Law of Moses* to the returned exiles. This takes place at the *Water Gate* in Jerusalem. The people listen with understanding, and the readings are interpreted for them. The people are so moved that they fall on their faces to worship the Lord, and they weep. Nehemiah reminded them that this is a holy day and a cause for celebration! He encouraged them to share with those who have nothing.


Five centuries later, in Nazareth, the people are under the yoke of the Romans. They long for a Messiah. They do the customary thing, go to the synagogue to hear the *Law and the Prophets* proclaimed! Now, Jesus had been baptized by John, had called his disciples, and even wrestled with Satan in the desert. He returns home to Nazareth, knowing who he is, and what his mission from God is. With the assurance of a prophet, Jesus read from Isaiah, those powerful, familiar passages of the *Servant Song*. He proclaimed his mission, here in the town where he grew up: he has come for the poor, the captives, the blind, the oppressed. It is an electrifying moment when he says, "Today, this Scripture has been fulfilled in your hearing."

Twenty centuries later, these words place the same demands on us. St. Paul tells us in our 2nd reading that all we baptized have a place in Jesus' mission and a role to play! The passage from Isaiah that Jesus makes his own, is not only referring to the ministry of Jesus, but also the ministry and mission for all of us. We are the ones to go out there and bring good news to others; liberate the **poor**, **the captives**, **the blind**, **the oppressed**. We, as baptized Christians, have the power to fulfill this scripture passage **in our hearing!** Maybe this week we can each do **one thing** for one person... to put flesh on these readings.


