





From the Pastor's Desk.

Christmas is a joyous occasion. Those of us who are committed to the Christian faith rejoice at the great love given to us in the coming of Jesus Christ. Those

not committed to Jesus Christ still find ways to celebrate the joy of Christmas with many joy filled traditions and family gatherings. But there are some, who find Christmas very difficult. I remember one woman who came to me many years ago and shared her struggle in celebrating Christmas after the death of her son. She struggled through many Christmases. She loved her son and each Christmas reminded her of the pain of missing him at the Christmas table. One day she went to Church and heard a homily about Christ's birth. She told me that it was because of that homily that she was able to celebrate Christmas once again. She realized that it was thanks to the birth of Jesus Christ that her son was in heaven, and that she would see him again. Christmas time is a perfect reflection of our life, filled with both joys and sorrows. As we listen to the account of Christ's birth we see that tension on display. There are joyful and celebratory moments: the goodness of Joseph and Mary, the kindness of strangers, the singing of angels, the reverence of shepherds. We also see pain and suffering: the envy of King Herod, the poverty of the holy family, the long journey filled with danger. Yes, our Lord Jesus comes to us and from the first moments of his incarnation chooses to experience everything that is human: joys and sorrow, love and hate, acceptance and rejection. Christmas is meant to be both comforting and challenging for Christians, after all, we wish to unite ourselves with Jesus and all of his experiences. Please be good to one another this Christmas, know that you are loved by God, and take the time to share that love with everyone you meet. And if you feel lonely this Christmas, just give me a ring and come right over. I will have a warm cup of tea and great sweets waiting to be shared.

A Seminarian's Thoughts:

What was the mountain of a lie that the Legion was built on? It is difficult to explain, without going into a long backstory, how shocking was the scandal Fr. William was about to reveal to me. Briefly, the Legion of Christ was founded in Mexico in 1941 by a 20-year old seminarian. Marcial Maciel. Given his bishop's permission, he started the group with just 13 boys. From poverty and small beginnings, the charismatic Fr. Maciel grew the Legion exponentially. It had to have been miraculous. By 1950, the Legion had a formation house in Rome. By 1965, they were officially approved by Pope Paul VI. In 1983, John Paul II himself personally approved their constitutions, something that never happens.

By this time the Legion was the fastest growing religious order, by far, in the entire world. They were in virtually every western country. They recruited numbers like no one had ever seen since St. Ignatius started the Jesuits. John Paul II saw them as the great hope for the future of the Church. He loved that they were so young and so on fire for Jesus Christ. This was exactly what the Holy Father wanted when he talked about the New Evangelization. While other religious orders were dying off and openly dissenting from Church teaching, the average age of a Legionary was 24, and they were devoted to the Church and the Magisterium. In 1991, John Paul II personally ordained 50 Legionary priests in celebration of the Legion's 50th anniversary. Those kinds of numbers were unheard of in other congregations of priests. Naturally, John Paul II

saw Fr. Maciel as one of the Church's greatest saints. Did not our Lord say you will know a tree by its fruits? So what was the problem?

The Hamilton Diocese is conducting the One Heart, One Soul Campaign to raise money for every Parish in the Diocese and for shared ministries. For a compilation of all questions asked regarding this campaign go to www.oneheartonesoul.ca

What is the state of diocesan finances? The diocesan financial picture is strong – the amount of assets has grown in recent years and investments are doing well. Meanwhile, the Diocese is generous with grants and loans to parishes and Catholic organizations within the Diocese. Parish assessments have been stable in recent years but have not



kept up with increases in diocesan operating costs. Property sales have been used more frequently to keep the Diocese's operating budget balanced and strong, and

many assets (such as the Care and Maintenance Fund for Cemeteries) are restricted and not at the Diocese's disposal. This is not an emergency situation. The Diocese is looking ahead and acting before any kind of emergency could develop. Overall, the campaign is a way to ensure that more parishes will be able to be self-sufficient over the long term, building up themselves and the Diocese at the same time.

What kind of financial transparency can we expect during the campaign and beyond? Transparency is a top priority for the Diocese. Summaries of diocesan financial reports from 2012 through 2017 are on the diocesan website, and copies of the full reports are available from the Diocese's financial office. Regular updates of campaign goals, projects and fundraising will be communicated during the campaign through the website, emails, social media, to name a few. 
