The Cathedral Basilica of Christ the King is the principal church of the Diocese of Hamilton and home to the Bishop of Hamilton. The word "cathedral" comes from "cathedra" or Bishop's chair located in the church. On February 25th, 2013, in recognition of the significance of its design, and its importance in the Diocese, the Cathedral was given the status of a *Minor Basilica* by Pope Benedict XVI. The Cathedral Basilica was completed in 1933, and is a very beautiful structure that is reflective of the lively faith of its parishioners and the entire Diocese of Hamilton.

The Cathedral Basilica's *Coat of Arms* presents a shield sheltered by the *ombrellino*, and with crossed keys representing the papal designation of basilica status. The shield has a symbol for Christ with the crown of thorns and the crown of glory. The motto in Latin *- every eye shall see him*.

CATHOLIC RITES OF BURIAL

Eulogies - are high praise, well-spoken, of the In secular funeral ceremonies the dead. primary feature of the gathering is the eulogy or sometimes, several eulogies. In the Catholic rites for funerals, a eulogy is not given during the celebration of the Funeral Mass. The reason is that the Mass is praise and worship of God alone. Often, the homilist will listen to the family's thoughts of their deceased loved one and weave the Word of God and the person's life. If members of the family wish to offer a eulogy the appropriate moments for this speech include the Vigil Prayers at the funeral home, or the graveside, or at the lunch gathering after the funeral.

FEAST OF CHRIST THE KING

On Sunday, November 24 we will celebrate the feast day of our patron – Christ the King – this feast falls on the 34th Sunday of Ordinary Time and marks the conclusion of the Liturgical Year. To celebrate this great feast – maybe invite neighbours or friends to join us at the Cathedral Basilica.

Advent

The joyful Season of Advent begins on December 1. Advent begins a new Liturgical Year and helps us prepare for the great feast of Christmas – the birth of Jesus. The coming Liturgical Year (C) will feature the Gospel of Luke on most Sundays of Ordinary Time. A good way to journey through Advent would be to read parts of Luke chapters 1 and 2 – the infancy narrative. In Advent we fervently pray – *Marantha!* – Come, Lord Jesus, come!



DILEXIT NOS

Delixit nos – "He loved us" is the latest Encyclical Letter of His Holiness, Pope Francis, published on October 24, 2024. In his fourth Encyclical Letter, the Holy Father
