

### A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR:

any of us will recognize the 'Beatitudes' from the Gospel of Matthew. It is popular with couples at their Marriage ceremonies as the Gospel passage. It is also very popular at funeral masses as well. I once heard a fellow priest say when in doubt "use the Beatitude passage for a Gospel reading at a Mass."

This Sunday, we read the Beatitudes from the Gospel of Luke. There are numerous differences between the two passages. We refer to Matthew's and Luke's versions of the Beatitudes as "The Sermon on the Mount", and yes, that is an accurate title for Matthew, but not for Luke.

Luke presents Jesus "coming down' and standing "on a stretch of level ground". We recall Jesus delivering this to the multitude in Matthew's Gospel. In Luke, however, Jesus speaks only to the disciples. Matthew's version is addressed to the rich and poor alike. Luke' is addressed only to those who would be termed 'rich', not to the poor. These differences are important. They give Luke's version a different meaning than Matthew's.

When we hear the Beatitudes, we think about what a specific group will receive in the future. It is important to note that in Luke's version, the first Beatitude is about what the 'poor' already have: the poor have already received the Kingdom of God. It is not something they will get later. Luke is showing that the world is not a great place for the poor, and Luke truly means the economically poor, not the "poor in spirit" of whom Matthew speaks. If the world is not so easy on the poor, how do they already have it? It doesn't look as though they have the Kingdom.

Luke is not talking about a place nor is he speaking about the poor having all their needs met; he is teaching about a way of living. What Luke is speaking of is a new culture. With Jesus' teaching there is a new 'culture of God' emerging in the world, a culture that stands opposed to the culture of the society in which the early disciples were living and in which we now live.

Matthew's gospel speaks of a transcendent world and how we should live for that world to come. In his Gospel, Luke teaches us to live in the world as it is right now. We live in it by helping build the cultural Kingdom of God.

Luke wrote for a Christian community which attracted many wealthy individuals. For many of these people being 'rich' was viewed as being an outward sign that a person was blessed or favoured by God. Being poor was a sign of being outside of God's family. Luke, using the words of Christ, reverses this notion. It is the poor who have the Kingdom, and they have it now. Luke reminds all of us that we are called to live within God's culture and to help those who are poor and to serve them.

With Lent approaching, we need to see that our reward is not recognition, but rather, it is knowing that we have pleased God by serving others.


