

A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR:

t is hard to believe that Lent begins in only ten days, with Ash Wednesday on March 5th.

When the Season of Lent begins, we are usually encouraged to adopt the Catholic tradition of 'giving up something for Lent'. Lent is about sacrifice and giving up. It is about fasting and abstaining. These are some of the ways people of the Scriptures purified themselves and made themselves ready for major religious events. Almsgiving, giving for the sake of the poor, has also been a part of religious purification and preparation.

Lent invites us to revisit these ancient ways, though hopefully we will move beyond our unimaginative practices of giving up sweets or soda, cigarettes or alcohol, for 40 days. If we are to be purified, if we are to be prepared to take part in the Resurrection, then we must sacrifice far more.

Lent asks us to sacrifice more than externals. Lent asks us to surrender those things within ourselves that keep us from following Jesus. Ultimately, Lent is about giving up unchristian attitudes.

This Sunday, our readings offer us enough material to reflect upon for the whole of Lent. They offer us a standard of forgiveness to which we may not be accustomed. They offer us a standard for Christian ethical behaviour, a standard that is opposite of what our society would have us practice.

The First Reading from First Samuel is a fascinating story which brings up images of old movies or TV shows whereby someone is poisoned by another person because of revenge or jealousy. Westerns had these images often.

We see this played out as Samuel recounts Saul's pursuit of David. Saul was the anointed of the Lord and David was anointed as the king to come. Saul had loved David like a son, but Saul began to be jealous of David's popularity. Saul began to pursue David intending to kill him and remove this threat. Saul had an army, David had only his companions.

It would be expected, given the opportunity, that David would in turn take Saul's life to 'get even'. The sleep of Saul and his army was in fact a Godgiven opportunity. David did not 'take advantage' of God's gift but instead acted as God would have acted.

He did not take Saul's life. David respected Saul's anointing by God. His act was an act of love, an act that showed David to be the better man.

All the readings this Sunday encourage us to examine the change in the rules in not seeking revenge but to instead follow God's love. Lent offers us an opportunity to practice this.

Winter Weather Conditions:


