

### A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR:

ith the NFL playoffs underway, I came across the story of a priest who was the chaplain of an NFL team. The priest came to know many of the players. Whether they were Catholic or not, he was always amazed at how many of the players were faithful to their religions.

The chaplain came to admire as well how the players played through pain and injuries. The players understood that their game is a violent one, and they considered that to be part of the game.

The priest was also amazed at how even small injuries can also be a challenge to the players and the team. One injury in particular is called 'turf toe'. This injury is a bruise that occurs at the base of the big toe. It usually occurs when the toe is jammed forcibly into the ground or when the toe is bent backwards too far. It can be a significant problem because players use the toe when they run and plant and push off. It can be so painful that they can't play at all.

The chaplain could not believe that such a small part of the body could affect a player or team in such a serious way. He thought of the words: "The whole is never greater than its parts, but without the parts, the whole will never be great."

St. Paul, in our second reading could have described the city of Corinth in his letter to the community with the same image as the chaplain did with the football team. Corinth was a large city which had a wealthy aspect to it. It was a city, too, that boasted a population rich in racial, ethnic, and religious diversity. This make-up made for a very diverse Christian community. Unfortunately, for the Corinthian Christian community, this diversity had worked against them.

What St. Paul experienced in Corinth was individuals and groups competing with each other. Groups became prideful and somewhat antagonistic by saying that "Our way or praying is better that yours' or, "Our gift of prophecy is better than your gift of interpretation!" Paul had to get the Christians of Corinth to see their diversity as a gift from God, a gift that had been given to serve the whole Church, not just parts of it.

Last week, Paul talked about the gifts of the Holy Spirit. This week he mentioned how all of us possess gifts of the Holy Spirit, but we are called to bring those gifts together to build a faithful community and to build up the Kingdom of God.

The whole human body suffers when one part is missing. All the readings of this Sunday remind us that we need others for success. To make us Christian, we must see how Jesus connected us with Himself and His mission. It is a mission that cannot be accomplished alone.

#### Sacraments of Baptism and Matrimony


