

A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR:

n this Third Sunday of Lent, we are given a warning by Jesus through the Gospel passage from Luke.

Luke's Gospel brings us news stories that were the talk of the people, though we today have no idea what had happened. The first story involved a brutal action by Pilate. He was well known for quick and violent reactions to situations. The Galileans were the thinkers of the region and loved new ideas. As a result, Galilee was often the seat of rebellions. It is then, just possible, that some Galileans had plotted an uprising. Whatever the case may have been, Pilate clearly had them killed and had their blood mixed in with religious sacrifices. It would have been horrific for the people of the time.

The second incident involved the walls built around Jerusalem. One of the walls had a tower overlooking the city. It is most likely the tower either fell or was being repaired and fell, killing several people. Again, anyone witnessing the event would have been horrified.

The audience, to whom Jesus was speaking, truly believed that the people killed by Pilate and those who died at the construction site died because these individuals did not keep the rules of their faith and fell into sin. Basically, it was their own fault that they died. Jesus was obviously annoyed with this attitude, making it clear to His audience that, unless they reformed, that is, began to take a different approach to their faith, they would meet the same end.

What Jesus was telling the people is that they must repent for their actions. Repentance is not just being sorry for one's sins. While sorrow is part of repentance, the real point is to make a deep and radical change in both one's perspective on the world in the light of our Faith and a change in one's commitment to God. To repent is to make a deep moral and spiritual transformation. Repentance, as Jesus describes it in Luke's Gospel, is to change one's mind about Jesus and commit oneself fully to Him.

Lent tasks us to examine our approach to God. To come to know God better implies that we are asking questions and learning. Both the news items and the parable of the fig tree in Luke's Gospel, remind us that time is short. God is willing to help us grow and mature, but He expects us to bear fruit. This whole Gospel passage presents two sides of God. On one hand, God is the Judge who will not hesitate to destroy the barren fig tree. On the other hand, He is the

Giver of Grace and Mercy. He will help us grow, but He is still the Judge who has high expectations.

Jesus is not using scare tactics or threats. He is motivating people to change their lives in deep, profound ways. This is the true challenge of Lent. It is to examine our lives and to practice living a whole life of repentance. It is not a life of constant confessions and of beating ourselves up. A life of repentance is a life of conversion, a life that works to grow closer to God every day.
