

A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR:

e have come to the last week in which we celebrate a Sunday of Ordinary Time. Next week we celebrate the Solemnity of Christ the King which ends the Church's liturgical year. The following Sunday, the First Sunday of Advent, we begin all over again.

Today's First Reading from Daniel and our Gospel passage from Mark, are known as 'Apocalyptic Literature' which exists in the belief that there will be a final showdown between good and evil.

This type of literature gains our attention through frightening images and then turns to its true purpose of offering hope. This literature of the Scriptures is written for people who are asking whether staying faithful is worth the cost. Whether it be the Book of Daniel, the Book of Revelation, or this chapter of Mark, every listener of these books has only one hope left, and that hope is God.

We think of Jesus as being a young person. Artwork over the centuries has provided this image, however, Jesus was about thirty years old when He started His public ministry which put Him in the oldest ten percent of the population. Rather than being seen as a young rabbi, Jesus would have been seen more as a wise old teacher. In that day, disease and malnutrition were so rampant that only one in five children lived past their first birthday. Most parents were dead by the time children reached the age of sixteen.

The concept of life being so short provides context for our passage today, presenting the last things Jesus said before His Passion began. Mark puts this Gospel passage as being close to the end of His life to help people more readily accept that Jesus could foresee what was coming.

In our reading from Daniel, we see something which had never been said before. "Many of those who sleep in the dust of the earth shall awake." This is the first expression of belief in a resurrection of the dead. This was the ultimate statement of hope. For those who choose to remain faithful despite persecution, fear, and hopelessness, God will offer life with Him.

Our reading on this last Sunday in Ordinary Time provides us with the stance that we are to take. Despite seeming to fear, we are not to fear. It is not evil that will come at the end of time, it will be Christ.

Next Sunday we will celebrate this coming day as we observe the Feast of Christ the King. We should take comfort in the knowledge that time has a beginning and an end, as do our lives. The Church does not want us to be afraid of this moment, but it does want us to be prepared. We know what is coming. We should be neither surprised nor afraid.


