

A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR:

e have returned with our weekly bulletin blurb after a three week hiatus. I wish to begin with blessings on this Thanksgiving weekend to all of you and your loved ones. Sometimes it may not be noticeable, but we do have a lot to be thankful for in our lives. Let us continue to pray that Almighty God will continue to bless us throughout our lives.

In the Gospel this Sunday, Jesus does not condemn wealth or the wealthy. Although the society of the day saw wealth as a sign of God's blessings, Jesus did not see wealth that way. Jesus did not see wealth as a sign of anything, rather, He saw it as a responsibility. Yes, it was a blessing of sorts, but blessings are given for a purpose, and wealth serves the purpose of allowing people to serve and be generous.

The young man who appears before Jesus in our Gospel today, is a good and righteous man. When he told Jesus that he had kept the commandments from the time of his youth, he was telling the truth. His goodness was apparent. The man was very sincere in wanting to know what else he could do to "inherit eternal life."

The problem for the man is seen in his question, "What can I do?" Essentially, Jesus responds that to be a true disciple, following Him must become the most important thing in life. We must also realize regarding the rich man's question, that simply, you can't do anything. Eternal life is a gift, not something we can win or achieve.

When Jesus initially responded to the young man's question, He stated with the fourth, fifth, sixth, seventh, and eighth commandments. He also added a commandment not to defraud anyone. In saying that keeping these commandments, qualified the young man for eternal life, Jesus linked the commandments having to do with justice in the community of the faithful. In telling the young man to go and sell his possessions and give to the poor and then to

follow Him is very consistent with the requirement of living justly.

There is one more thing worth noting in this Gospel passage. It says Jesus loved the man because he had been good and faithful, but Jesus did not go running off after the man, begging him to come back. Jesus neither changed nor softened His answer to help the man out, rather, He spoke a clear truth; we must allow Jesus to become the most important thing in our lives.

Mark's Gospel makes clear that what Jesus has to offer is life in the Kingdom of God. This is a gift. We cannot do anything to earn it, rather, what God expects in return is that we will live the life of love. The problem of riches is not the riches themselves. The problem is the priority we give to riches and the pursuit of them. We must place God first in our lives.

Once again, blessings to all on this Thanksgiving weekend.
