

# A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR:

or the second week in a row, Jesus asks the question, "What do you want me to do for you?" Would we not love to have Jesus ask the question of us! I'm sure most of us could make lists of the things we wish Jesus would do for us. But the question is, would they be things that mattered?

This question was asked last week to James and John as they approached Jesus hoping to achieve positions of power and glory at His right hand and left hand in the Kingdom.

It was a misguided request; the kind people ask when they do not know what they really want. Bartimaeus, however, knew what he wanted. He wanted to see Jesus.

In this contrast, one can see themselves as they can be in the Apostles James and John. In Bartimaeus, one can see what they should really become.

Bartimaeus was a blind man who wished to be able to see, but Jesus gave him more than physical sight Bartimaeus is allowed to see something all of us would love to behold, something we live all of our lives hoping for. We want to see God as He really is.

We need to have this as one of our deepest longings. If we could just see God as He really is, we like Bartimaeus would quickly and without reservation or hesitation, simply "follow Him up the road." James and John wanted something worthless, Bartimaeus wanted a real gift, and he was given one.

In his Gospel, Mark shows a contrast between Peter, who said that Jesus was the Messiah but did not grasp what this meant, and James and John and their request to sit at Jesus's left and right; with Bartimaeus, a blind man who saw Jesus for who He really was.

This is the kind of sight Jesus offers to us. This is the kind of response Jesus hopes for from us. If we pray for real sight, or perhaps insight and we look closely enough, we might see the God who loves us. With this, we would not hesitate to follow as a disciple.
