

#### **GOSPEL REFLECTION**

#### "A man had a fig tree..."

The Gospel today refers to two incidents. The first is an atrocity brought about by human cruelty. Orders from Pilate have instigated a massacre of a number of Galileans who were sacrificing in the Temple. The second incident is due to natural causes: the fall of a tower in Siloam, occasioning the death of 18 persons. Jesus is told of the first and then recalls the second for two reasons. First, he wards off something to which the religious instinct is ever prone when faced with episodes of this kind: to conclude that the victims were being punished for sinfulness from which others - specifically themselves - were exempt. Jesus heads off all thinking of this kind. He mentions the second incident and goes on to tell the parable about the fig tree to make the point that, far from attempting to judge the sinfulness of others, everyone should interpret such events as a warning to take stock of their own lives lest far greater disaster – eternal ruin – befall them.

Jesus is the Gardener, and we are the fig tree. This parable leads us to look at our lives and examine whether or not we bear good fruit for the Kingdom of Heaven. Jesus comes to you to cultivate the soil of your heart, fertilizing it with His holy Word, watering it with His Sacraments and doing all He can to give you the opportunity to produce the fruit of charity in your life.

Imagine the joy in the Hearts of our Lord and the Father in Heaven if they were to look upon you and see good fruit being produced beyond expectation. Why wouldn't this be your goal in life? Reflect, today, upon the image of you being this fig tree and our Lord as the divine Gardener. Commit yourself to His actions of tilling and fertilizing. You do so by strengthening your commitment to reading and understanding the Word of God, by participating more fully in the Sacraments, by being more focused upon your daily prayer, by examining your conscience more fully, and by sincerely confessing your sins. Do all you can to cooperate with the action of our divine Gardener and you will be amazed at the good fruit that begins to pour forth from your life.

In the First Reading, the first words that God speaks out of the bush are, "Moses, Moses!" He calls Moses by name. There is a particularity to Moses' mission. God knew that Moses was the right person for the job and shows this by using his own name as he calls him forward. As stewards, we too are all called by name to a special mission. We each have our own unique set of gifts that can be used for the glory of Christ and the Church. It is up to us to heed the call because no one else can do the particular mission God has ordained for us. (Excerpts from: Fr. Brendan Byrne, SJ; My Catholic Life; Archdiocese Office of Formation.)
