

ALLELUIA!

The Lenten season has come to an end, and the Easter season has begun. St. Augustine of Hippo describes Lent as signifying the troubles and trials of our earthly life and the Easter season as signifying the happiness and the life that will be ours in the future. We see this reflected in Jesus' passion and death (Lent) and in his resurrection and glorification (Easter). As we enter the fifty days of the Easter season, we once again say or sing the word that we have been avoiding since Ash Wednesday: "Alleluia!"

"Alleluia" is a joyful exclamation meaning "Praise the Lord" or "God be praised". St. Augustine is quoted as saying, "We are an Easter people and 'Alleluia' is our song!" Even though it is probably not a word we typically use outside of our worship at church, he urges us to sing and live Alleluia in our lives by giving praise to God with our whole being with our lips, voices, minds, and actions.

Lives that praise God are lives well-lived. They are lives that, despite the trials and challenges of our earthly existence, give witness to the Resurrection and the hope that flows from it. They are lives of loving relationships, forgiveness, and joy. They are lives that seek the good of others, even if sacrifice is involved. Jesus invites us to this type of life, a life of ongoing transformation as we become a greater reflection of Christ. Let us follow in his ways so that we truly might be Easter people and follow him to new life.

May you and your family experience God's abundant life, love, and peace! Happy Easter! Alleluia!
