

Transformed by Truth and Love

Have you ever gotten the wrong impression of someone? After a while, you learn that the person you took to be aloof or judgemental was really just uncomfortable around new people. Maybe you have encountered a hyperconfident person, only to learn later that they, too, have experienced great self-doubt, insecurity.

It is said that we draw lasting conclusions about others from first impressions. How easy it is, then, to "get it wrong," for none of us can fully understand another, with their own vast experiences, feelings, and traits, and be able to judge them in an instant, or maybe ever.

Since 1856, St. Basil's Parish has been home to people of all ages and needs. We are blessed because you are all here!

Palm Sunday feels to me like *the* story, of "getting it wrong." After Jesus enters Jerusalem to great praise, some of the Pharisees, chief priests, and scribes immediately judge him to be a threat. He is later condemned and put to death. Rather than recognising what Jesus is truly about, they reach the quick conclusion that he is somehow maleficent, perhaps a power monger. They overlook that Jesus's only power resides in the fact that he "comes in the name of the Lord," and that he brings peace.

The greatest insult and injury are then inflicted on Jesus. To many of the witnesses, especially those who had not gotten to know Jesus well, it must have come as a surprise when he asked his Father to forgive his persecutors. How confusing this must have been for those watching. Jesus's humble acceptance of the situation and his plea for mercy on his persecutors reveal to those present, and to us, the deeper truth of his identity.

Given the ferocity of Jesus's tormentors, it is then surprising how immediately the centurion reacts to Our Lord's death: "Certainly, this man was innocent." The crowds also react with shame, returning home beating their breasts. The Truth is so powerful, it knocks them completely off their preconceptions. How swiftly, suddenly, even shockingly, God has revealed the Truth, and how instantaneously the people are transformed.

How many times in my life have I had an impression, a prejudice, only to have something happen that opens my eyes and transforms my understanding? How many times has God surprised me with forgiveness, mercy, and the strength to change weaknesses I thought permanent? How many times have others surprised me by their words or actions, and changed my understanding of them or of the reality around me?

There are times in our lives when God surprises

us. Yes, change, growth, transformation can be a gradual, gentle process, but sometimes God's Truth and Love can also jump out of the events of our everyday lives, showing us where we may have been mistaken, and how, by Providence, we can be forever transformed.

May this Lenten and Easter Season transform each one of us and bring us some measure of new and deeper understandings of Our Lord's role in our lives and in the lives of those around us.


