PROCLAIMING THE GOOD NEWS

Christ is Risen! Indeed He is Risen!

At the end of Mark's Gospel, the Risen Lord tells his disciples, "Go into all the world and proclaim the good news to the whole creation" (16.15). Recently, I was speaking with someone who was curious of what the good news or gospel is all about. In response, I spoke of the core of the good news, which is what we are celebrating now—the Resurrection and the new life that Christ has made possible for us. Jesus showed us that death does not have the last word. Even though Jesus had foretold to his

disciples his passion, death, and rising on the third day, it seemed to come as a surprise to them. Maybe it was beyond what they could imagine. Perhaps they could not move past the suffering and death of their dear friend to see how God was at work.

Shortly after that conversation, I happened to speak with another person who was in the midst of one of life's dark moments, like one of those moments when we struggle to understand why God allowed something bad to happen. As I listened to what she was dealing with, I thought back to my earlier conversation. What was the good news that I could proclaim to her? While there was nothing I could do to fix the situation, I took some time to pray with her and tried to offer her some hope—that God was somehow working to bring about life even though it might not be clearly seen at the moment. I encouraged her to look for glimmers of light, reflecting the light of Christ, the light that scatters the darkness in our world.

At the beginning of the Easter Vigil, we see that happening in a symbolic way as the paschal candle is carried into the church and becomes the source of light that spreads to other candles throughout the church to produce a warm glow. Then we hear the powerful words of the Exsultet in praise of the glorious night that we are celebrating and the effects of the good news of Christ. Here is some of what is proclaimed:

"The sanctifying power of this night dispels wickedness, washes faults away, restores innocence to the fallen, and joy to mourners, drives out hatred, fosters concord, and brings down the mighty."

As we spend 50 days celebrating the Easter season, may we be mindful of how we can apply these words and proclaim the good news to the people and situations we encounter, thus opening them up to greater hope and the ability to see the wonderful, and sometimes unexpected, ways of God.
