

LET GO AND LET GOD TRANSFORM US

A few years ago, I found myself clinging to a situation that was causing me pain. Letting go felt impossible—it meant stepping into the unknown, and I was terrified of losing what felt familiar, even though it was no longer lifegiving. In my desperation, I turned to prayer and fasting, but not in a way that sought God's will. Instead, I was trying to negotiate with Him, hoping my physical discomfort would convince Him to change my circumstances. It took time for me to realize that I was resisting the very transformation God was offering me. When I finally surrendered, my prayer changed. I asked God to help me let go, to heal me, and to guide me as I started afresh. In that surrender, I found a deeper sense of purpose and a

renewed trust in His plan.

This week's readings echo this theme of surrender and new life. In the first reading, God promises to do for us something new, even in the wilderness of our struggles. He invites us to trust Him, even when the path ahead seems unclear. St. Paul reminds us in the second reading that our suffering can lead to righteousness and a more intimate relationship with God. And in the Gospel, we see the woman caught in adultery encounter Christ's mercy, reminding us that God's love is not bound by our failures or shortcomings. Like her, we are called to let go of shame and fear, and to embrace the new life He offers.

This Lent, I invite us to reflect on what we might need to let go of in order to fully receive the transformation God desires for us. Are there situations, habits, or fears that we are clinging to, even when they no longer serve us? How can we trust God to lead us into something new, even when it feels uncertain? Let us plant seeds of hope through prayer, fasting, and almsgiving, trusting that God is doing something beautiful in our lives, even in the midst of our struggles. I pray that we may have the courage to surrender, to hope, and to embrace the new life He is calling us to live. Amen.


