
FIFTY YEARS

The first Sunday of Advent this year marks an important milestone in the Church's life. The first Sunday of Advent, 1969 marks the beginning of the use of the Missal devised by the Second Vatican Council, otherwise known as the Novus Ordo, or Ordinary Form of the Mass. Prior to 1969, the Mass had been celebrated more or less the same way since the Council of Trent (1545-1563); however this Mass can still celebrated as the Usus Antiquior (Extraordinary Form), more commonly known simply as *The Latin Mass* thanks to a motu proprio promulgated by Pope Benedict XVI in 2007.

The changes in the rite were developed in response to the call at the Second Vatican Council for a "fully conscious, and active participation" of the faithful. What had sadly become the case by the 1950s was a complete disengagement of the faithful while attending Mass; praying private devotionals,

or reciting the rosary silently during the Mass were unfortunately quite common. Although certainly in keeping with a healthy devotional life, these are a distraction to the Sacrifice which takes place in the Mass. The causes for the distraction were many, and so the rite was revised to allow for, among other things, the use of the vernacular (even translations of what the priest was saying in Latin weren't allowed up until the early 20th century!). The faithful were now not just allowed, but invited, to participate in the Mass.

Pope Paul VI remarked: "It is at such a moment as this that we get a better understanding of the value of historical tradition and the communion of the saints. This change will affect the ceremonies of the Mass. We shall become aware, perhaps with some feeling of annoyance, that the ceremonies at the altar are no longer being carried out with the same words and gestures to which we were accustomedperhaps so much accustomed that we no longer took any notice of them. This change also touches the faithful. It is intended to interest each one of those present, to draw them out of their customary personal devotions or their usual torpor." (Address to General Audience, 26 November, 1969) "The repository has been opened up, as the people's own spoken language now becomes part of their prayer. Lips that have often been still, sealed as it were, now at last begin to move, as the whole assembly can speak its part in the colloquy [...] No longer do we have the sad phenomenon of people being conversant and vocal about every human subject yet silent and apathetic in the house of God. How sublime it is to hear during Mass the communal recitation of the Our Father! In this way the Sunday Mass is not just an obligation but a pleasure, not just fulfilled as a duty, but claimed as a right." (Homily at Parish in Rome, 27 March 1966)

Let us pray, on this 50th anniversary, that we continue to be engaged in the Liturgy of the Church, and come to appreciate and understand the Mass more fully.
