

In our children's Catechesis of the Good Shepherd program we have a song about Church's liturgical calendar: "Purple is for preparation, White is for celebration," we sing, pointing to the reality that every great feast is preceded by a time of preparation. As our liturgical colour shifts to purple this week and we enter the season of Advent, we should ask: for what are we preparing?

Certainly, we are preparing for Christmas and the celebration of the Mystery of the Incarnation - God coming to dwell with us in the flesh in the person of Jesus, the long-awaited Messiah. Our first reading gives us a glimpse into the yearning for this Promised One. In today's Gospel, Jesus also points to his Second Coming at the end of time, the parousia (adventus) which I wrote about a few weeks ago. We trust that in the fullness of

time God will transform this world with abiding presence. While we live in-between these two moments we also have opportunities to welcome Christ into our hearts and recognize God's presence in places, faces, and experiences that we encounter daily. This is what St. Paul urges the Thessalonians to do as they live their faith. These three "Comings of Christ" that we find in today's scripture – in the flesh (historical), in glory (future), and in our hearts (present) – is what the Season of Advent prepares us for as we approach the celebration of Christmas.

We live in a world that is already fully into a version of Christmas. The lights are up, parties are in full swing, Christmas music and movies are streaming, and the Santa Claus Parade has already come and gone. Advent is gobbled up by the race towards Christmas tables and gifts and the frenzy of finals and completing assignments. Our Gospel challenges us to not become "weighed down" by either excessive celebration or anxiety, but instead to live with a recognition that our "redemption is drawing near." While I don't mean to be a curmudgeon about Christmas, I wonder what it would look like to take Advent seriously as a time of preparation for Christ's presence. Is there a spiritual practice that you want to take on, or to enter with greater intentionality? Consider our weekly prayer opportunities or special Advent events. Can we pray as a parish that God might strengthen us in holiness and help us abound in love? What would transform in our lives personally and communally if we committed this Advent to recognizing Christ's presence in each person and every moment?
