THE COMING OF THE JUDGE

By M.J. Santa Ana

A common thread in this week's readings is the anticipation and preparation of the coming of the Lord as judge. Isaiah calls the people of Israel to "strengthen the weak hearts, and make firm the feeble knees" for the impending arrival of God's deliverance, when miraculous things such as the blind seeing and the lame walking will take place. James exhorts his fellow believers to "not grumble against one another" so they may avoid judgment from the coming Judge who is "standing at the doors".

When we hear of judgment, particularly in a Biblical context, our first instinct is to think of punishment, destruction and the end times. However, this week's readings remind us that for those who heard the word of God first, God's coming in judgment was not something to be feared but something to look forward to. As Isaiah says, it is when "He will come and save you."

Things will be set right by God in ways that seem counter-intuitive to the ordinary existence of this world. In our Gospel, when the disciples of John the Baptist ask Jesus if He is the one foretold of, Jesus instructs them to report back to their master the miraculous things they have seen and heard - the blind seeing, the lame walking, the dead living again – affirming the prophetic message of Isaiah. These are the signs God has come to reconcile the world to Himself. We are called to identify with those who God saves and heals. precisely because we are the ones He came to deliver. Therefore, for us, God's judgment is not a sword He uses to cut us down, but a shield in which He is keeping us safe for our salvation.

CELEBRATING OUR JEWISH HERITAGE

As part of our ongoing Advent focus, the Parashat Hashavuah known as the "Torah portion" of the week is given a Hebrew name that reflects a significant word or short phrase in the selected verses. This week's Parashat Hashavuah is entitled "Va'yeitzi," meaning "And he went out" and it is Genesis 28:10-32:3.

In this week's Torah potion, Jacob (Abraham's grandson) has just fled Beersheba amidst great family turmoil and embarks on the long journey to visit his uncle, Laban, in Haran.

Along the way, Jacob finds a place to rest his head. As he sleeps soundly, Jacob has a dream about a staircase to heaven in which God reveals important details about the unfolding Abrahamic covenant.

"And he dreamed that there was a ladder set up on the earth, the top of it reaching to heaven; and the angels of God were ascending and descending on it" (28:12).

Once Jacob finally reaches Haran and meets Laban, the two make an arrangement that Jacob will work for seven years and eventually marry one of Laban's daughters. The Torah portion ends with Jacob meeting Rachel at a well in a striking parallel to the way Jacob's mother, Rebekah, was chosen to marry Isaac.

Re-read the above passage about Jacob's dream. "Angels of God" are present all over the world "ascending and descending" between earth and heaven.

Discussion Questions:

Do you have a relationship with a Guardian Angel? Do you celebrate the Feast of the Guardian Angels?

Share a time when you experienced the love and protection of the "Angels of God."
