
EXCITEMENT

The First and Second reading and the Gospel today all express anticipation and excitement. The First reading tells that "They shall obtain joy and gladness..." The Second reading tells them to be "patient" and not grumble while waiting for joy. There is a longing for this joy, and don't we all become impatient when waiting for something wonderful, a change from hard times to happy times?

The Gospel tells about John the Baptist, sitting in prison, sending word to the disciples that the one they have been awaiting is "the ONE" who is among them! He is pretty excited even in his hard time! The First reading and the Gospel come together so nicely here as we see those things hoped for have come to pass... "the blind receive their sight, the deaf hear, the dead are raised, and the poor have good news brought to them."







Here we are thousands of years later in the middle of Advent, waiting. There is excitement all around. For some there is also grief and we should be mindful of that too. We have also created anxiety around this wonderful event of Christmas – Christ's birth. We are kind of like the disciples who had to be told by John the Baptist that Jesus, "THE ONE" had arrived. We don't realize that we already have what we need – that for which we have been waiting.

What are we waiting for? We are all in different stages of life...some stages very much harder than other stages. Some folks are awaiting a wonderful new year, others are grieving a loss or struggling in the midst of life's sometimes seemingly endless challenges. "Artificial" Christmas Joy can make us feel left out especially if we compare our lives to others. We can no doubt find our lives lacking.

What is the gift which we anticipate with excitement? He is born! A new life for us! What did he leave for us? His most important commandment as our gift - to love Him and to love one another, and the Holy Spirit. God is with us. We have grace all around us, but just as the disciples did not see, it is also hard for us to see sometimes. We are still waiting for the perfect thing to happen. I know that I am guilty of saying "when I finally finish this thing then all will be better", instead of looking for the lesson in the hard time that will give me some little joy in the challenge. Finding joy in little daily things even when life is tough can get me through if I remember to be grateful for little things. We don't know what tough times folks are facing. Being present especially when things are very hard is really hard to do. We are like those disciples who did not see the miracles all around. No doubt those were hard times for them too.

This can be kind of overwhelming – thinking about all this. In this time leading up to Christmas, I hope to take a breath and focus on the love that is around and if I don't see it then I am going to make it happen! So, if you see me smiling like the Cheshire Cat and hugging everyone, which I kind of do anyway, please join me....or maybe shake hands at least! Look folks in the eye when you say "peace be with you" and mean it....and let's do that the rest of the time too. It can only be good – and isn't that our job

anyway, to spread the love and mean it? That's a gift to everyone - happy, sad, cranky, grieving, in good times or hard times. We might never know how that simple gesture could make such a difference. We will be working with our gift – The Holy Spirit.
