

## God's Face Shining on Us

"O God, let your face shine on us, and we shall be saved". In my times of prayer, I seem to keep noticing these words from the Old Testament, including from Psalm 80, which is the responsorial psalm for the 4th Sunday of Advent, and other passages like the Priestly Blessing (Numbers 6.24-26) and Psalm 4. The authors of these passages recognized the power of God's face shining on us, bringing us salvation, blessing, and peace. What is a bit paradoxical is that there are also passages warning that to see God face-to-face would cause one to die (Exodus 33.20), though it did not always happen, like when Jacob wrestled with God, whom he saw, and yet his life was preserved (Genesis 32.30). If death could result, then to see God's face might not be something sought.

Things changed with the Incarnation, when God became a human being in the person of Jesus, in that little child in the manger in Bethlehem. What was God trying to communicate with us in the birth of Jesus? For one thing, humility. God chose to be brought low, to become vulnerable and accessible to us like never before. God, who had already entered into a covenant with a chosen people, now demonstrated a desire for the whole of humanity to know God in the flesh, to see God face-to-face without fear. There really is not anything less threatening than a baby, especially a sleeping baby, and really nothing much more loveable.

Our annual celebration of Christmas reminds us of how God's face has shone on us in a powerful, yet gentle, way with the Eternal Word becoming flesh. Even though we were not around when Jesus was born or the years that he walked the earth, we can learn about him in the scriptures and share the stories with others. That is not enough, though. God wants people of all times and places to encounter Emmanuel personally. We have the Holy Spirit who introduces us to Jesus, with the hope that we will accept his love and in turn desire to love him and anyone God

places in our lives.

On Christmas Eve this year, Pope Francis kicks off the Jubilee Year of Hope by opening the Holy Doors at St. Peter's Basilica. In the Papal Bull, SPES NON CONFUNDIT ("Hope does not disappoint"), he expresses his desire that the Jubilee "be a moment of genuine, personal encounter with the Lord Jesus" and that we be renewed in the hope "that nothing and no one may ever separate us from God's love". That is the message that Jesus came to share, first as a baby, and now through you and me as the Holy Spirit empowers us to bring blessings to others by reflecting Christ, whose face we are called to show. In the words of Numbers 6.24-26:

The Lord bless you and keep you; the Lord make his face to shine upon you, and be gracious to you; the Lord lift up his countenance upon you, and give you peace.
