#### A HIGHWAY FOR OUR GOD



Today's gospel begins by listing the powerful men of John the Baptist's age from the Roman emperor on down; each and every one is less than savory. In his own way each ruler demonstrates that sin held sway at the time. Arrayed against these many forces of evil was a lone voice for God. The baptism of John and the far greater baptism that we have each received is a call to be that lone voice for God. The baptism we have received, however, is also a promise that our world is not just the domain of petty princes but also of the true king, Christ.

We have been marked with the sign of him who has promised to always be with us. It is he and not us who has begun the work of salvation and will bring it to joyful completion. The holy emblem on our brow is the sign of both the work and the joy of

that salvation. It is a labour and a happiness that reminds us that the mercy and righteousness of Christ have never left the world.

This seal of our second birth is also the gateway into the New Jerusalem, the Church, that gathers all her children east and west to do battle with the impious potentates of the world. The true prophets of our age are not lone voices but rather speak with the voice of the truth that has echoed down through the ages *semper eadem*. It is the voice of Christ as found in his beloved Church.

The prophecy of reform in our age, as in the age of John, is not one founded on power but in truth. Only we ourselves know if our soul is a highway for God and his Word. Let us during this season of Advent pay heed to the lone voice in the wilderness and the myriad saints united in our same baptism who speak with a singular voice exhorting us to practice every virtue. So that when the day of completion comes our pure and blameless lives may have produced a harvest of righteousness.
