
LIVING THE VOWS

This weekend on the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord, the Catholic Church celebrates the World Day for Consecrated Life, during which we remember and pray for sisters, brothers, religious priests, consecrated virgins, and hermits, as well as members of Secular Institutes. We are blessed in our parish to have members representing various religious communities including the Loretto Sisters, Sisters of St. Joseph, Xaviere Sisters, Order of Preachers (Dominicans), Society of Jesus (Jesuits), and the Basilian Fathers. My apologies for anyone I missed.

This August 14th will make 15 years since I became a member of the Basilian Fathers by professing the vows of poverty, chastity, and obedience. Included in those vows was the resolve to "give myself with my whole heart to this religious community, so that by the grace of the Holy Spirit

and the help of the Blessed Virgin Mary, I may seek perfect charity in the service of God and the Church". For us Basilians, that service involves a commitment to education and evangelization.

While consecrated women and men typically make a public profession of the vows, also known as the "evangelical counsels", Francis J. Moloney, SDB in A Life of Promise claims that "the call to poverty, chastity, and obedience ... stands at the heart of any form of life which claims to be modelled upon the life-style of the poor, chaste, and obedient Jesus of Nazareth" (15). That is, all the baptized—no matter their vocation—are called to a poor, chaste, and obedient way of life as a way of following Christ as presented in the Gospels. I invite you to consider whether you agree with Moloney's claim.

While poverty for a consecrated person might involve renouncing the individual ownership of property as I did when I sold my beautiful Audi TT, it could also be understood as a sacrificial sharing of what we have with others—something anyone can do. Chastity (not to be equated with "celibacy") is a virtue, which involves the manner in which one lives one's sexuality depending on one's vocation. For a consecrated person chastity involves remaining celibate. Obedience is that ongoing willingness to open our ears and our hearts to God's call and to respond accordingly.

To live the evangelical counsels definitely requires a lot of grace—whether or not we have made a public profession of the evangelical counsels. Whatever our vocation, let us be united in prayer to help each other live as faithful disciples of Jesus Christ, and may those God is calling to serve as consecrated women and men hear God's voice and respond with generous hearts.

THE EUCHARIST, BOND OF LOVE

Susan K. Wood, SCL, Academic Dean of Regis College, presents "The Eucharist: Bond of Love (viniculum caritatis)"

The Constitution on the Liturgy from Vatican II called the Eucharist a "viniculum caritatis," "a bond of love" (SC 47). This bond of love is the bond not only between an individual and the risen Lord, but also the bond of love among all those who receive the Eucharist, and is thus inseparable from its ecclesial and social meanings.

This talk explores the relationship between the Eucharist and the bond of charity within the Christian community: it is not a "warm, fuzzy feeling", but has a deep ontological density.
