LOVE AND CHARITY

I must confess that the second reading for this week gave me pause - many of us will recognize it as a reading often proclaimed at weddings. And I think that it is safe to say that approximately 75% of the 35-40 weddings that take place at Saint Basil's every year incorporate this excerpt from Paul's First Letter to the Corinthians.

So often, we miscategorise this reading as being about romantic love. We assume that Paul is talking about the love between spouses or partners. As meaningful as we may find this interpretation, it is important to point out that the reading is instead referencing charity: that is, God's love for us, our love for God, and our love of neighbour.

Paul is reminding his reader that charity is

at the core of Christian living and urging a fundamental shift in their way of living out their faith.

How often do we forget to connect our faith to our sense of charity? So often, our faith life, our sense of charity, and our self are not aligned: our ego, our prejudice, our sense of self, all get in the way of being charitable to "the other". How often do we limit our charity to "the familiar"? How often do we forget that our charity is especially called on when we encounter "the other"?

He said to him, "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind.' This is the greatest and first commandment. And a second is like it: 'You shall love your neighbour as yourself.' On these two commandments hang all the law and the prophets." (Mt 22:37-40)

There will be a truck parked at the church all weekend, and volunteers will be there before and after the Saturday and Sunday Masses. Please be sure to tie up your donation bags to make handling easier, and to prevent spoilage.


