

# BELOVED BAPTIZED CHILDREN

On the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord, we cross the threshold from the season of Christmas into Ordinary Time – the liturgical season focused on our growth as disciples of Jesus.

In the Gospel we hear that while in prayer after his baptism, Jesus hears these words: **"You are my Son, the Beloved; with you I am well pleased."** This message about his identity – this experience of abundant love – launches Jesus' public ministry, and sends him on a mission to proclaim and embody of the reign of God.

By our baptism, we are children of God, part of the Body of Christ, and called to share in his mission. God says to each and every one of us today, and every day: "you are my beloved child. I am delighted in you." Some days we can hear this message clearly, and some days it feels dim and

distant. I wonder if the same was true for Jesus – if, in the midst of challenges, he returned to prayer to ground himself in this love again and again so he could continue in his mission. I do know that prayer always reminds me of who I am in God's eyes, and calls me to love more deeply.

Belovedness is not a prize meant for a select few – God desires the whole of creation to be wrapped up in God's abundant, merciful, loving kindness. Our second reading proclaims that God's love and mercy is not earned by our behaviour, but freely given to us so that we may be transformed and so transform our world. A spiritual director friend of mine puts it like this: **"there's nothing you can do to make God love you less, there's nothing you can do to make God love you more – God just loves you. The question is how will you respond?"** 

On this Feast, let us allow our hearts to be open anew to this message of our identity. We are beloved children of God, called and empowered by our baptism to be like Christ and follow in the way of discipleship, justice, and peace in the world. The same Spirit that dwelt in Jesus has been poured out to us, and invites us to partner in living as signs of God's Love, so that all people in our troubled world may know the good news and transforming power of God's abundant love.

During this Jubilee Year in particular, consider how you might want to dedicate time to encounter God's love for you, or how we might share God's love with others in concrete ways.

Every other Monday, starting January 27, 7:00pm to 8:30pm


