

Jubilee Year Resolutions (INSPIRED BY THE WISE MEN)

The Jubilee Year, which began on Christmas Eve, will continue until Epiphany 2026. Celebrated by the Church every 25 years, this is a special time to remind us of the need for spiritual renewal and reconciliation, through prayer, service, pilgrimage, and seeking and offering forgiveness. The theme of this year's Jubilee is "Pilgrims of Hope", and our parish will be offering numerous opportunities throughout the year to engage with the Jubilee. Pilgrimage is a key characteristic of the Jubilee Year. In particular this Jubilee invites us to reflect on our personal faith journey to encounter Christ, as well as the ways that the Spirit illuminates our path as a pilgrim church as we journey together guided by and bearing hope to our world.

The Feast of Epiphany, which we celebrate today, continues the celebration of the season of Christmas by reminding us that the Incarnation is Good News for all people. As we enter the Jubilee Year, let us learn from the first pilgrims to travel to encounter Christ.

Here are my spiritual resolutions, inspired by the Magi:

- Pay attention to God's invitation. Notice the beauty of creation. Listen attentively to others. Trace where God is speaking in your dreams and your deepest desires.
- Risk encountering the Face of God in others. Go out of your comfort zone. Say yes to hard conversations, ask questions, be present when you feel lost or helpless, ask for help when you need it.
- Allow yourself to be surprised. God may show up in unexpected, humble places, and unfamiliar faces. Do not let your expectations become your idols, you may lose sight of where God is.
- Be joyful. Let your breath be taken away by beauty, by simplicity, by relationships, by love. When you catch glimpses of God's love, rejoice!
- Open your treasures. Acknowledge that all is gift, do not clench tightly open your hands and your heart to God's work. Offer your gifts, your time, your whole self, to a God of love who wants to create abundant life in and through you. Offer love, forgiveness, understanding, and compassion to those who need it.
- Resist oppression. Pay attention and notice when power and authority are being abused. Practice civil disobedience. Speak out against injustice. Volunteer. Protect those who are vulnerable.
- Allow yourself to be transformed. Commit concretely to how your encounter with Christ will impact your life. Go home by another way. Be a witness to the light by your life of hope-filled living.
