TIME AWAY

In today's Gospel we see that Jesus and the disciples were so overwhelmed with the needs and demands of others that they need time to get away, to think and pray, to plan and dream, and to rest and regroup. The Gospel of Mark tells us that they were so busy that they couldn't even find time to eat. So Jesus says to them, "Come away to a deserted place all by yourselves and rest a while."

There are times when we need to get away and tend to ourselves. If we don't take time for ourselves, our bodies will take it for us. How often have you found yourself trying to fight off a yawn or stay awake at a meeting? We know that more serious things that can happen if we don't take the time to rest or exercise, to slow down and calm down. We can also find ourselves lonely if we do not make quality time to be with friends and family.

And we need time for prayer; personal time, for private prayer and time to pray in community.

Psalm 23 reminds us that, "The Lord is my shepherd; there is nothing I shall want. Fresh and green are the pastures where he gives me repose; Near restful waters he leads me; to revive my drooping spirit."

But that doesn't excuse us from being aware of the world around us. Today's Gospel points us back to the world we leave behind as we tend to our personal or communal needs. From their private place Jesus looks and sees all those who were still seeking healing and comfort from him. The Gospel tells us that later Jesus, *"saw a great crowd; and he had compassion for them, because they were like sheep without a shepherd; and he began to teach them many things".*
