
THE ROAD TO OUR FATHER'S HOUSE

At first glance, the reading from Genesis speaks only of despair as sin enters the world for the first time. Created in complete freedom, Adam and Eve are given dominion over Eden and are tasked with caring for one another and for creation, all the while enjoying a filial relationship with God. Jealous of God's relationship with man, Satan attacks Eve as a means of leading both of them into sin. Deceptively, he tells Adam and Eve that they will not die and will be made happy when they disregard God's will for them. Therefore, the first sin is not so much the physical act of eating the fruit but rather the fact that Adam and Eve allow trust in their Creator to die in their hearts.

Despite this, God does not abandon them and, in fact, promises great consolation that will







heal the insurmountable rift that sin caused between man and God. The promise of a Redeemer in Genesis 3:15 is called the Protoevangelium: the first announcement of the Good News and the promise that despair will be conquered by hope.

Today's Gospel presents the solution to restoring our filial relationship with God. Jesus, as the Son of God, is the Redeemer promised in the Protoevangelium and His words in today's Gospel show us the way back to our Father's house. Upon learning that His family awaits Him outside, Christ pauses and rhetorically considers those who can be called His family. He then gets straight to the heart of our wound of disobedience and tells us that doing the will of God is what will restore our filial relationship with our Father and will lead us to the happiness of eternal life. Christ Himself shows the way and opens the door for us on the Cross, but we must still each freely choose to do God's will.

Therefore, God's general will is to grant us eternal life; but his will is also unique to each of us because we ourselves are unique. Sometimes it is easy to do what God asks of us; at other times we wonder why the way has to be difficult, or painful, or unclear. Yet, even as Adam and Eve chose hope over despair, so we are asked to once again put our trust in our Creator who, with our cooperation, will lead us home to his house of many rooms.
