"SHE HAS SHOWN GREAT LOVE"

How many times in our lives have we played the role of Simon from today's Gospel account? During dinner together. Simon the Pharisee questions Jesus' willingness to accept the hospitality of a "sinful" woman who showed up unexpectedly. In Jesus' time, the very presence of this marginalized woman and her subsequent actions- weeping at Jesus' feet, bathing them with her tears, anointing them with ointment then drying them with her hairwould have been understandably shocking during an all-male dinner party. What naturally followed was Simon's skepticism. Simon believed that if Jesus were truly a Prophet he would know that this woman is a sinner and therefore would not break with custom or purity laws by allowing her to touch him. However, this very encounter proved just what a great Prophet Jesus really was.

Even in the Old Testament, prophets acted counterculturally and served as a mouthpiece for God's message- often times in an environment that proved unwilling to hear such a message despite its great

need. Through this interaction with the woman, Jesus was able to communicate God's message loud and clear. In fact, Jesus used a parable about two debtors to ensure no ambiguity in conveying God's abundant love and forgiveness to the sinner. According to Jesus' parable, a creditor had two debtors, "one owed five hundred denarii, the other fifty." However when neither could repay the debt, the creditor cancelled the debts for both of them. Looking at the woman, Jesus explained to Simon that he felt truly graced by the presence and hospitality of a contrite sinner kneeling at his feet. The woman's sins were forgiven because in spite of her unworthiness she managed to show Jesus "great love."

What a relevant message for us today. No matter what crosses we bear- or how lengthy our self-perceived laundry list of sins happens to be- God wants to forgive us and we must continually bear witness to Christ through "great love" shown to others. We must not play the part of Simon by comparing our personal sins to that of another assuming that we are better or worse off than them. In faith, place all that you are by the feet of Jesus, and He will transform your unworthiness and sinfulness into profound joy and selfless love. A selfless love that both helps keep us close and draws others to Christ.

FAMILY OF FAITH CAMPAIGN UPDATE

Three weeks ago, I invited you into a conversation about our Family of Faith Campaign performance. I am thankful for the many responses I have received. As I heard from a number of people, there were two consistent messages: First, there is general confusion about where the money goes or what it will be used for. So here is what you need to know: Family of Faith is over and above all the other collections you are used to experiencing, and the Archdiocese is hoping you make a gift to this campaign specifically without decreasing amounts you already give on a regular basis. All of this means that Family of Faith is not the same as our regular collection for the operations of St. Basil's Parish; nor is it the same as our own restoration/community capital fund; nor is it the same as ShareLife; nor is it is the same as any of the other second collections throughout the year. This parish has also been focused on its own "capital campaign" over almost two decades. Though we do not yet have all of the funds necessary to do all of the work we need to do; the Archdiocese has come to us now to accomplish a different and equally important task- which we do our best to meet because we are part of the Archdiocese and they have asked this of us. At the same time, you can only give what you can give. I cannot demand this of you, especially when I am aware of this parish's immense generosity. But if you have the ability to make a contribution, over and above the rest, then I ask you to give for those who cannot, to support those parishes who cannot support themselves. Together, our gift is made out of our abundance – and we thank God for the ability to do so. The second message I heard concerned communications. Some parishioners have told me that they thought I would be making personal phone calls or writing more letters. While we did try to form a committee, there were too many limitations to make an impact, and we quickly heard that parishioners wanted to hear from me

Please know that if you call or write, I will respond, but I am only one person. And more of anything means sacrificing something, so please consider this the letter – the phone call – the ask. Lastly, we all understand that people need time to plan their finances, which is why the option of pledging is available. If you cannot give now, but want to do so, then this also fulfills our commitment. There are pledge forms in the vestibule or you can always visit our website and find the campaign logo on the homepage. Again, I am so grateful for all that you do and have done.
