## WORSHIP THE LIVING GOD

The feast of the Body and Blood of Christ continues the celebration of the Feast of the Holy Spirit that we celebrated not so long ago. We have been provided with the fortitude, courage and wisdom to proclaim Christ's message in our daily lives. Today we are reminded that as a Church this is not a burden but a communal call we accept every time we receive the Eucharist.

Paul's letter to the Hebrews reminds us







today of the great gift we received when our Lord gave His life for us. He writes, "how much more will the blood of Christ, who through the eternal Spirit offered himself unblemished to God, cleanse our conscience from dead works to worship the living God." We do not receive the Eucharist passively. We are presented with Christ's body, we affirm His presence, and we consume. In this act we fully accept that we are the Body of Christ and we should rejoice in the knowledge that we are perpetually joined with the God who loves us. Through the Eucharist we can both give thanks for all God has given us and renew our spirit so that we may continue to be the face of God in the world.

This knowledge that we are inseparable from Jesus our Saviour can be full of overwhelming emotions. But for the children who received their First Communion last month. this interconnectedness is not hard to accept. They learned this year that when the priest pours the wine and water into the chalice those of us gathered can actually SEE our relationship with God. All the wine is poured, all of God. A drop of water is poured, a small piece of us. That small drop can never be separated from God. As we watch the priest perform this action we are also reminded that Christ our Lord was human and divine. So not only can we not be separated from Jesus, but He cannot be separated from His own humanity. There is no one better to accompany us on our earthly journey than the Saviour who understands all our joys and struggles.

Our God is a living God because through the receiving of the Eucharist we are given the strength to bring God's light into the world. It is hard, because being human is hard. So today let us receive the Eucharist with great joy and allow ourselves to be fully one with the Body and Blood of Jesus. In doing so may our ears, minds, and hearts be open to wherever God is calling us to be His face in the world.
