#### SIGHT IN THE DIMNESS Rev. Chris Valka, CSB

Our Gospel for the Scrutinies this week reintroduces us to the blind man whose sight is restored by Jesus. Most certainly, it is a chance for us to consider what we are blind to: the injustices of our society; the abuses to creation; the social and individual sinfulness of our own lives; or perhaps the goodness of others that may be harder to see.

However, I also think it is a chance for us to consider how we often live in dimness thinking it is the light. Our own building has made this abundantly clear with the recent lighting changes. Most of us thought that the light was adequate enough, but now that we have tripled the light, it is hard to imagine how we ever saw anything in the building before!

It is not that our lives are in darkness, but nor are we basking in the full radiance of Christ's light. Thus, we have to learn how to move and see in the dimness.

A few years ago, I met a fellow who helped me understand what this means. He had recently lost most of his sight as a result of a car accident.

At first, he hurt himself frequently because he kept trying to move and perceive the world as he did before. And he was angry because all he could see was darkness.

In time, he began to perceive the world differently and move a little slower. He found that he *could see*, though not as he did before.

What I learned from him is that, until the day comes when we bask fully in the radiant light of Christ, we too should learn to move a little slower and see the world differently, lest we hurt ourselves in the dimness. We can learn to see the light in the shadows as so long as we focus on that, then the darkness will not seem so dark.

#### MUSIC CORNER: MUSIC IN LENT

Why do we have a prelude and postlude this weekend but not in any other weekend in Lent? The Fourth Sunday of Lent is known as Laetare Sunday; it takes its name from the *incipit* (the first few words of an opening line of a text) for this Sunday's *Introit: "Laetare Jerusalem"*, or "Rejoice, O Jerusalem". This Sunday, which is just past the halfway mark in Lent, allows us to observe a slightly less austere point in the season. This practice of having a prelude and postlude in Lent only for the fourth Sunday comes from the *General Instruction of the Roman Missal*.

#### PAST ECO-THEOLOGY PRESENTATION

This past Wednesday, we heard a wonderful presentation from Dennis O'Heara on Eco-Theology and prayed the Stations of the Cross with a focus on Ecology and Social Justice, as it was written by parishioners of St. Basil's. #### PRAYING THROUGH LENT . . .

#### The Liturgy of the Hours: An Introduction

The Liturgy of the Hours or the "Divine Office" is an ancient prayer of the church, said in person, or more conventionally by a community. Compiled in the Breviary, the prayers are recited at regular intervals throughout the 24 hours of the day.

Since 2013, a group has been praying Lauds - the dawn prayer - every Saturday at 9:00am at St. Basil. With the prayers of the prayer basket in the centre, and with a special prayer for vocations, we gather in the sanctuary and join our voices with those of priests, nuns, other religious, and lay people all over the world reciting this liturgy.

In keeping with tradition, we alternate reciting stanzas between the left and right choir. This is to embody prayer as both speaking and listening - as an outpouring of our longing for God, and a willingness to receive God in our hearts. Each half-hour prayer includes a reading from the Breviary, and concludes with a few minutes of silent reflection.
