THE WAY, THE TRUTH, AND THE LIFE

I find it very interesting and relatable that even after Jesus' resurrection, his disciples continue to ask clarifying questions. Thomas asks for clarity on how to remain a follower of Christ since it was unclear where Jesus was going. In a documentary on Christology, Bishop Barron commented that some religious leaders or spiritual gurus throughout history have directed their followers' attention to a method, theory, or way of living. Jesus Christ drew followers to himself saying "I am the way, the truth, and the life." The Gospels are full of stories in which we have plenty of evidence that Jesus spoke and acted in "the very person of God." Jesus did not simply offer followers a spiritual methodology, he gave of himself as the embodiment of the way to God directly- as the very wellspring through which God's own love and compassion, power and awe flow.

Still confused, Philip asks to see the Father. Even after witnessing great miracles, and participating in Jesus' earthly ministry, Philip demands that Jesus show him the very source of his authority. Jesus simply replies "believe me that I am in the Father and the Father is in me." I cannot really fault Thomas. It is very human to want proof. Also, theologians have wrestled with Christ's divine Sonship for centuries. However, in this passage, Jesus asserts that- as God- His works speak for themselves and that, incredibly "the one who believes in me will also do the works that I do and, in fact, will do greater works than these, because I am going to the Father."

In this statement, Jesus effectively answers both Thomas and Philip. By the power of the resurrection, believers in Christ were granted a permanent relationship and that modeling Christ as the Way is a sign of our own participation in God's words and works on earth.

A MOTHER'S DAY REFLECTION By Marilena Berardinelli

One of the family ministries at St. Basil's is our Baptism Preparation class. In the class a significant amount of time is dedicated to exploring what it means for parents (and godparents) to live as priest, prophet, and king and by extension to raise children in this tradition. Today's second reading which calls Christians "to be a holy priesthood" is not Paul's attempt at spiritual prose, but an invitation echoed in the Rite of Baptisma roadmap to living as a follower of Jesus Christ.

The Baptism Preparation class underlines that living as priest is not exclusive to those wearing a roman collar, but the vocation of each baptized lay person to live a life of joyful sacrifice. The couples present are asked to recognize the sacrifices they make for their children, families, neighbors, and world, and identify where the Spirit is calling them to grow in this respect. I am always humbled by these sharings, especially by those made by the moms in attendance.

As a mom of three small children (6, 4 and 9 months) I am keenly aware that my life is lived in service to these children entrusted to me by God. Like the moms in the class I have sacrificed my body (birthing three children makes the words of consecration "this is my body given up for you" deeply profound and intimate), my career, my couple/"me" time, and frankly, any hope of an uninterrupted and worry free night of sleep.

Mother's Day is an occasion to recognize this sacrifice as more than just "stuff" moms do, but from a Christian perspective to celebrate the women in our lives who faithfully and authentically seek to live their "holy priesthood".

Mother's Day is also an opportunity for the greater Body of Christ to reflect on how we minister to moms. In our everyday Church experiences how do we nurture their distinct spirituality (especially in the early years of motherhood) and how do we listen to and care for moms as they sacrifice and care for their children?

May today's Mother's Day celebrations be an inspiration for all Christians to nurture our common baptismal mission to give of ourselves without counting the cost.

To all our mothers in the pews and beyond our doors, I echo the words of Pope Francis and thank you for what you are for your family and what you give to the Church and the world. Happy Mother's Day!


