A SIMPLE MESSAGE

In the first reading today, Paul and Barnabas are busy traveling around sharing the Gospel and building up the Church here on earth. Their commission in making disciples of all nations seems to have be taken quite seriously, traveling from Lystra to Iconium and Antioch, then Pisidia and Pamphylia, and further still to Perga and Attalia.

Their work here is a response to what we hear in the Gospel reading, Christ reveals His imminent departure from the world. Presumably, this creates a great deal of uncertainty for the apostles; someone who they've left everything behind to follow, will be leaving them shortly. Their worries, I'm sure, would have been mostly logistical – Who will lead us? What will we do? Where will we go?







Christ's response is to provide a new commandment: "I give you a new commandment, that you love one another. Just as I have loved you, you also should love one another. By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another." (John 13.34-35)

The simplicity of the commandment is, presumably, what has lead to Paul and Barnabas' success on their travels. A message so simple, yet so profound, is the key to evangelization. Pope Francis expands upon the centrality of this commandment in Gaudete et Exsultate, writing: "In other words, amid the thicket of precepts and prescriptions, Jesus clears a way to seeing two faces, that of the Father and that of our brother. He does not give us two more formulas or two more commands. He gives us two faces, or better yet, one alone: the face of God reflected in so many other faces. For in every one of our brothers and sisters, especially the least, the most vulnerable, the defenceless and those in need, God's very image is found. Indeed, with the scraps of this frail humanity, the Lord will shape his final work of art. For "what endures, what has value in life, what riches do not disappear? Surely these two: the Lord and our neighbour. These two riches do not disappear!" (#61)

May we continue to see the face of Christ in others around us, and love them fully, without exception, as Christ loves us.
