THE LOVE OF A SHEPHERD

In the Atrium of Saint Basil's there is a sheepfold. This simple wire gate on a round piece of wood serves as a gateway for the children of the Atrium to personally encounter the Good Shepherd. Every week children sit and work with the sheepfold. The children open the gate and move each individual sheep behind the Good Shepherd as he leads them out.

The children move each sheep with care and concern, knowing that the Good Shepherd loves and knows each one by name. In the Atrium the focus is on the essential and the intimate. Even though the 3 year old may neither fully comprehend or articulate that the Good Shepherd is Jesus and they are the sheep, they feel a pulling to this material that allows them to feel like the sheep in the parable; overflowing with the love of, and love for, the Good Shepherd.

Jesus tells his disciples in the Gospel today, "Very Truly, I tell you, I am the gate for the sheep." The presentation of the Good Shepherd material is not the first presentation the children in the atrium receive but it is a gate leading to a personal relationship with Jesus Christ. None of us can fully appreciate the suffering and sacrifice of Jesus Christ if we do not first have an immense love for the compassionate Good Shepherd who considers us to be His own.

As adults it is hard to not only openly admit our love for the Good Shepherd but to also openly receive His love. When this moment is presented to adults using the materials of the Atrium it leaves them shaken as they are called to remember that they are known by the Good Shepherd despite their feelings of abandonment.

Children do not find comprehending the love of the Good Shepherd difficult. They openly receive love and unconditionally respond with love.

As they grow with this parable they come to outwardly express their strong love for the Good Shepherd who serves as a source of comfort and strength. When presenting this material to Senior Kindergarten children last month one child exclaimed, "I think the Good Shepherd is Jesus!" As a catechist it was a moment of great joy to watch her fall in love with Jesus Christ the Good Shepherd. While she did not realize that she is also present amongst the sheep her exclamation of joy demonstrates the desire we all have to have a relationship with our loving, gentle, and compassionate Saviour.

This moment we hear in the Gospel today is about awe, intimacy, and love. For Jesus also tells us, in the Gospel of Matthew, to become humble like a child. May today serve as an invitation for us to connect to the childlike love we have for the Good Shepherd as we are reminded of the allencompassing love that the Good Shepherd has for us, the sheep of his flock.
