#### Wondering about Widows

Throughout the scriptures, widows were considered among the most vulnerable (alongside orphans and strangers). Their status was seen as a temperature check: if we are attentive and responsive to the most vulnerable, then we are living in accordance with God's will. For, as our Psalm proclaims, the Lord sustains and seeks justice for the oppressed.

A traditional reading of today's Gospel will praise the widow's sacrificial offering. Yet I hear Jesus say... "beware the scribes [...] they devour the houses of widows." The scribes were legal and spiritual leaders who interpreted the obligations of right living. I wonder: did the widow gave all she had because that was expected and demanded

by her religious institutions and society? Did she have no choice but to give all her livelihood, and be left with nothing? Perhaps Jesus is lamenting her situation, and calling into question the entire religious and political system that impoverishes and burdens her.

I consider how our society and our church today asks the most vulnerable to give all they have, in ways that are oppressive and unjust. In addition to financial burdens, how often do we demand the benefit of the doubt, or patience, or harder work from the poor, the foreigner, and the oppressed, rather than listening to them and centering their needs, as God desires us to do?

At the same time, we know that there is something exemplary about both the widows in today's readings. The Widow of Zarephath responds with hospitality and generosity to a stranger, and God brings miraculous abundance. In their encounter and generous sharing, she, her household, and her guest find more than they each had before. I believe that we who know marginalization within our lives have learned the importance of both human interdependence and dependence on God. Repeatedly in my own life, my sense of scarcity has been transformed towards abundance through open-heartedness, community, and radical trust in God, even or especially in the face of the dehumanizing demands of the powers that be. How might God be inviting us into encounter, generosity, and abundance in our lives today?

I watch and learn from Jesus. In the Gospel, Jesus sits, sees, speaks, and calls people together. He takes time to observe reality, and be attentive to the world around him, especially to the most vulnerable. He speaks out against injustice, and highlights the stories and experiences of the marginalized. He invites into community. How can we be more like Christ? Who do we need to sit with? Who or what do we need to see (in new ways)? What words demand to be spoken? What communities do we need to join or form?
