
In the first reading, we note the central command spoken by Moses: "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your might. Keep these words that I am commanding you today in your heart." (Deuteronomy 6.6)

In the Gospel reading, Jesus teaches us a second great commandment: "You shall love your neighbour as yourself." (Mark 12.31)

Taking elements of the old rules regarding sacrifices, the second reading shows us Jesus has forever served as the perfect sacrifice, offering Himself for our sins.

What really helps to tie our readings together this week is the Gospel Acclamation:
