Jesuit priest Michael Moynahan, writes about Christ in his poem *Incarnation: "He came to share your plight, your fight, your night, and point you toward tomorrow."* I recall these words when considering today's scriptures. Jesus, fully God, and fully human, bridges the divide we perceive between our reality (earth), and the kingdom of God (heaven). Jesus reveals a different kingdom than what we expect. The disciples in the Gospel desire power, authority, and honour. Jesus instead (again) reminds us that his way is one of humble service that will ultimately lead to suffering and death. His "throne of grace" is not a lofty seat over, but the place of a servant who washes others' feet.

God's ways of power are not about might and oppression but love and solidarity with the suffering. Through his incarnation, life, ministry, suffering and death, Jesus demonstrates that there is no human experience that God does not want to share with us. Through the resurrection and ascension of Christ, God invites all humanity to share in the divine life, with no barrier that can get in the way of God's deep and abundant love for us. This is the Good News! The kingdom of God - one of abundant love, justice, and peace - is breaking into our world through Christ. "The earth is full of the steadfast love of the Lord!" As Christians, we are called to wholeheartedly live in love and pursue God's kingdom, even if this means embracing the suffering that may come with following God's ways. I try to live my discipleship daily by asking "what is the next, best, most loving thing to do?"

May the Eucharist we celebrate nourish us with Jesus' great love for us (shown in vulnerability and service), and may it empower us to live as his disciples in our world that needs his love.
