RECOGNIZING AND RECONCILING RELATIONSHIPS

Today's readings trouble me. Too often they have been misused to justify judging those who are divorced, relegating women to an inferior position in church and society, and human domination over creation. Unfortunately, I don't have enough bulletin space to counter all these poor interpretations! This week's *Faith in Focus* encourages me to return with an open heart to encounter the Living Word, asking God to guide my understanding.

I find myself reflecting on relationships. We believe in a Trinity - in dynamic relationship within God's very self. In Genesis, God breathes this life into humanity and desires joyful partnership for us. We are from love, of love, for love. Whether or not we are married, we have probably all experienced meeting someone "at last!" who was like us. That spark of mutual recognition leads me to delight and love. We have also all experienced the painful reality of broken relationships. In the Gospel, Jesus challenges me to have a softer heart, and to find paths to restore relationship. If you have ever felt like one of the Gospel's "little children," judged and prevented from encountering Jesus because of who you are or what you have done, please know that Jesus is seeking you out, desiring to embrace you! As Church, how can we support marriage and family life, accompany those experiencing difficult relationships, and stop creating obstacles to encountering Christ?

The second reading proclaims that the ultimate One who is like us, bone of our bones and flesh of our flesh, is Jesus – God Enfleshed – who comes to share in our life and suffering. Do we recognize him with joy? Jesus reveals a new way of being in loving relationship with God and re-forms us back into one family. Let us respond by seeking reconciliation – with God, between human beings, and with all creation.

FAITH IN FOCUS

In this series we reflect on excerpts of Church documents that invites us to deepen our life of faith. For the next few weeks, we will be reading sections on The Eucharist featured in "Teach Us to Pray" (2024) published for the Year of Prayer, to prepares us for the 2025 Jubilee Year.

"Listen carefully to the Word of God: maintain a receptive, meditative attitude that enlightens the heart and mind of every Christian because the Word is "living". By listening and through personal recollection, it is possible to translate the Word into everyday life, receiving help and consolation. Therefore, especially when standing up at the time of the proclamation of the Gospel, we are called to recognize the presence of the Lord who, through the minister, still speaks to us today in the Eucharistic celebration." Reflect: As you listen to the readings, notice what stirs in your heart. What words or phrases stand out? Consider reading the scriptures before you come to Mass, or returning to them again after Mass. You can join Breaking Open the Word, Tuesdays evenings on Zoom, to engage the sacred scriptures each week.

CATECHESIS OF THE GOOD SHEPHERD

The Catechesis of the Good Shepherd (CGS) is a Montessori-based approach to the religious education of children, which offers children the most essential aspects of our faith, trusting this will nurture their capacity to enjoy God's loving presence in their life. - Monday October 21: Singing the Readings and Responses


