

PASTORAL CARE

BAPTISMS - If you are a registered parishioner of Assumption Parish (or another parish) and attend Mass regularly, there is no waiting period. You may call the Parish Office to schedule a date and you must attend a Baptism preparation session prior to the baptism. If you belong to another parish, a letter of permission from your Pastor is required. If you are not a parishioner of any parish, you must register, attend Mass regularly, and there is a three-month waiting period before your child can be baptized.

CONFESSIONS - First Friday-(during exposition of the Blessed Sacrament), 8:30 am to 9:00 am; First Saturday - 9:30 am to 10:00 am By appointment only; Sundays - 11:30 am to 12:00 Noon, By appointment only.

MARRIAGES - One of the couple must be a registered member of the parish for at least 6 months and attend Mass here regularly. Please make arrangements at least six months before the wedding date. Marriage Preparation Course required.

SPIRITUAL COUNSELING - By appointment.

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK & COMMUNION FOR SHUT-INS -

Anyone who wishes to receive Anointing of the Sick or Holy Communion please call the office to have your name put on the list.

FUNERALS - Arrangements should be made firstly with the church, and then with the funeral director to insure proper Christian burial.

RECOLLECTION WITH FRIAR JOBE ABBASS

A GUIDE to the Readings of the THIRD SUNDAY of EASTER

In the FIRST READING (Acts of the Apostles 3:13-15;17-19), Peter addressed his fellow Jews, who marveled over the healing of a lame man and presumed that he and John had done this by their own power.

He clarifies that the one at work is none other than the GOD of their ancestors. Peter then emphasizes his <u>central message</u>: Jesus, whom they and their leaders had handed over and had sentenced to death, is, in fact, "the holy and righteous one," "the Author of Life," and the one whom GOD raised and glorified.

Also, Peter notes that their action came from ignorance — this justifies the current offer of salvation to them. He also declares that these events are the fulfillment of what God has proclaimed through the Prophets. Addressed to the Jewish people of that time, the call to "**turn to GOD**" offers the promise of being cleansed of their sins but also a warning that their fate depends on responding to the apostles' prophetic words.

The SECOND READING (1 John 2:1-5) meanwhile addresses the Christian community about the reality of sins, even among community leaders. The writer <u>encourages them to avoid sin</u> and assures them that Jesus is their advocate if they do! Jesus Christ is the *atoning sacrifice* for their sins and those of the whole world. Continuing the message is an encouragement: "We come to know GOD by following His commandments." Finally, and most important to remember, there is an unbreakable bond between knowing God and keeping the commandments.





2
