

## **PASTORAL CARE**

**BAPTISMS** - If you are a registered parishioner of Assumption Parish (or another parish) and attend Mass regularly, there is no waiting period. You may call the Parish Office to schedule a date and you must attend a Baptism preparation session prior to the baptism. If you belong to another parish, a letter of permission from your Pastor is required. If you are not a parishioner of any parish, you must register, attend Mass regularly, and there is a three-month waiting period before your child can be baptized.

**CONFESSIONS** - First Friday-(during exposition of the Blessed Sacrament), 8:30 am to 9:00 am; First Saturday – 9:30 am to 10:00 am By appointment only; Sundays – 11:30 am to 12:00 Noon, By appointment only.

**MARRIAGES** - One of the couple must be a registered member of the parish for at least 6 months and attend Mass here regularly. Please make arrangements at least six months before the wedding date. Marriage Preparation Course required.

**SPIRITUAL COUNSELING -** By appointment.

Anyone who wishes to receive Anointing of the Sick or Holy Communion please call the office to have your name put on the list.

## PASTORAL COUNCIL ELECTION

Nomination of candidates for Parish pastoral Council members is on-going. <u>Registered</u> parishioners may <u>nominate fellow member of the</u> <u>community</u> up to APRIL 30 at 6PM. The Election will be in May 2023.

PLEASE NOTE THE FOLLOWING PROCESSES

**1. At the end of the nomination period**, the Election Committee would <u>make a list of all</u> <u>nominations</u> and <u>check the person's eligibility</u>. Then a list of those nominated will be posted in the bulletin boards of the parish

**2.** On the Parish Bulletin of May 6-7, 2023, the names of the nominees with the duties and responsibilities of the members of Pastoral Council will be publish for the consideration of all parishioners.

**3. ELECTION DAYS** (May 20-24, 2023), <u>all</u> forms/ ballots will be collected from the designated drop-box, and then votes will be tallied by the Election Committee.

**4.** May 27 & 28, 2023, will be the <u>formal</u> <u>announcement of the election results</u> by Election Committee, *after having the confirmation of those who are selected to serve*.

**5.** The **Rite of Commissioning of the Pastoral Council** will be on a specific schedule chosen through consensus by the persons involved considering among others, that there must be the presence of a majority number of the faithful.

## From the PASTOR's 0779CE

Lent has ended. We celebrated our **Sacred Triduum** with grateful hearts for the ALMIGHTY FATHER's faithful love fully revealed in the **Passion, Death, And Resurrection** of JESUS CHRIST, His Son, and the promised advocate, the HOLY SPIRIT.

Last EASTER SUNDAY, we resumed a Filipino tradition, SALUBONG, a procession where we express our belief that Jesus revealed Himself to His Mother, the Blessed Virgin Mary, after the Resurrection. Also, this time in all Masses, we made the RENEWAL OF OUR BAPTISMAL PROMISES - this is significant because most of us received the sacrament when we were infants or too young to remember or appreciate the SACRAMENT of BAPTISM through which the guilt of original sin washed clean and it made us children of GOD, members of the Church founded by Jesus. More so, St. Paul tells us it is a participation in the death and burial of Christ (Romans and 6:4 Colossians 2:12). The CATECHISM OF THE CATHOLIC CHURCH (CCC 1265) puts it: "Baptism not only purifies from all sins, but also makes the neophyte 'a new creature,' an adopted son of God, who has become a 'partaker of the divine nature,' member of Christ and co-heir with him, and a temple of the Holy Spirit.

During this EASTER SEASON, we celebrate our Baptism - it configured us to Christ and sealed us with an indelible spiritual character of this belongingness. <u>No sin can erase this mark, even</u> if sin prevents Baptism from bearing the fruits of salvation.

O what a great gift! What a loving God is He, therefore, we proclaim the truth that **the LORD** has **RISEN by the power of God!** We are EASTER PEOPLE, and ALLELUIA is our cry.
