

# **PASTORAL CARE**

**BAPTISMS** - If you are a registered parishioner of Assumption Parish (or another parish) and attend Mass regularly, there is no waiting period. You may call the Parish Office to schedule a date and must attend a baptism preparation session prior to the baptism. If you belong to another parish, a letter of permission from your Pastor is required. If you are not a parishioner of any parish, you must register, attend Mass regularly, and there is a three-month waiting period before your child can be baptized.

**CONFESSIONS** - By appointment only.

**MARRIAGES** - One of the couple must be a registered member of the parish for at least 6 months and attend Mass here regularly. Please make arrangements at least six months before the wedding date. Marriage Preparation Course required.

SPIRITUAL COUNSELING - By appointment.

# Featured Saint of the Week

St. Adalbert, Bishop & Martyr (April 23)

St. Adalbert (956-977) was consecrated Bishop of Prague, whence he encouraged the evangelization of the Magyars. For having given sanctuary to a noble-woman convicted of adultery – and having excommunicated those involved in her being dragged from the church and murdered – he was exiled by the nobles of Prague. He preached the Gospel in Poland, Hungary, Russia, and Prussia, where he was martyred.

## A MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

Peace in the Risen Lord!

In today's Gospel, Jesus teaches his disciples the purpose and meaning of the Old Testament. He taught them that the OT refers to Him. His coming was the fulfillment of the OT. He also taught them that all God's promises is fulfilled in His Passion, Death, and Resurrection. And since, Jesus is inseparable with his Body (seen in His Resurrection). The Church, which is the Body of Christ, continues His mission. He exhorts the Church through the Apostles, to preach forgiveness of sins to all nations, beginning with Jerusalem.

The first reading shows us the disciples responding to that mission. They were teaching the people about the OT in the light of Jesus' Passion, Death, and Resurrection.

The Church as the Bride of Christ, and the Body of Christ, continues up to today the mandate of Jesus to preach the Gospel, in or out of season. The Church as a mother, speaks the truth for her children, even if they do not want to listen. The Church like Christ is patient in waiting for their return.

In all three readings, the Scriptures are interpreted to fulfill and serve the Church's mission—to reveal the truth about Jesus, to bring people to repentance, the wiping away of sins, and the perfection of their love for God and neighbour.

In the same way, we too should hear the Scriptures, not to know more "about" Jesus, but to encounter and truly know Him personally, and to know His plan for our lives.
